CONGRATULATIONS TO PIRBRIGHT UNDER 15s FOOTBALL TEAM!

The 2021/22 football season has just ended with the Pirbright FC under 15 team completing one of the most successful seasons in the clubs history. The team embarked on their first season playing in the North East Hampshire Premier division and began the season with some style winning 7 straight games in all competitions. Over the course of the season the team racked up 18 wins out of 24 games, scoring 87 goals in the process. The team also completed the season with an unbeaten home record with 13 wins out of 14 games on the village green including a 3-1 win against Headley FC to

clinch the title. The village green also hosted the NEHYL Wellesley trophy final at the end of May with Pirbright closing the season by beating Churt FC 6-3 and winning a league and cup double. The team will be collecting their trophies at a league presentation event in June.

- latest update

How our story has moved on since the last update in May!

It is now clear that there is enthusiasm and support in both parishes. The only thing which emerged which is different from the United Benefice model which Pirbright had been discussing is that Wyke would prefer to start with a Benefice held in Plurality. In relationship terms, it can be compared with a friendship (plurality) rather than an engagement (united benefice) with little difference in practical terms as both models allow us to work together, sharing one full time priest. In this way, both PCCs feel that our relationship can be built up on a sound footing, encouraging partnership working in a natural way before hopefully moving to create a united benefice.

We are now working (May/June) on agreeing an overarching vision between both parishes which will be a significant element of our parish profiles to attract good candidates. As expected, our joint discussions have found many areas where we have similar aspirations, skills and challenges and there is tangible warmth and openness.

Beyond this, we now have a recruitment timeline – agreement of the Parish Profile by both PCCs in July followed by advertisement in August, shortlisting in September and interviews in October. It is highly unlikely that our new priest will be in post until March/April so we are having to practise great patience and trust in God! In the meantime, Rev'd Bev's licence as our Interim Priest has very sadly ended but we are again being lovingly looked after by the same small team of visiting priests from the first vacancy, including Rev'd Bev and Rev'd Gary so we are very blessed.

Please continue to pray for a listening ear to God's guidance, both for ourselves and potential candidates.



JULY GARDENING TIPS from Wellie

Divide congested clumps of bearded iris after flowering. Dead head bedding plants, roses and herbaceous plants to encourage more flowers. Trim evergreen hedges, including conifers. Feed dahlias and cannas every two weeks with a high potassium fertilizer, such as tomato feed. Prune early-summer flowering shrubs, such as Philadelphus, once they have finished flowering. Cut back flowered growth to a strong lower shoot and thin out up to a fifth of old, woody stems.

Cut back hardy geraniums and delphiniums to ground level after they have had their first flush of flowers to encourage new foliage and more flowers later in the year. Feed after cutting back.

Pinch out climbing beans when they reach the top of their supports. Water courgettes consistently so they continue to crop well and keep picking them to encourage new ones to grow. Keep tomatoes well watered to prevent blossom end rot. Clear ponds of

> algae and blanket weed. Continue mowing lawns, but raise height if we still have a drought. Newly turfed and seeded lawns need to be kept watered.
