Just a thought.....

Love your neighbour,,,

When Jesus was asked which of God's commandments should come first, he replied with the command to "love the Lord your God with all your heart, soul and mind" but straight after this is the command to "Love your neighbour as yourself". If I am honest when reading this passage, neighbour has often been associated in my mind with my friends, work colleagues or those from church, but not often have I thought about my actual neighbours.

I want to start by thanking you all. Just before Christmas we as a family moved to Pirbright. Upon arriving in this beautiful village we have experienced first hand neighbourly love. Neighbours have called by to say hello, some even bearing gifts and cards (and even meals!). Some of whom we had not even previously met, but have nonetheless put a card through our door or stopped us on the streets to say hi. Others have shown this love as I have begun to walk around the village. You have demonstrated to our family, in a practical way, what loving your neighbour looks like. I am certain that from now on I will not be able to read those words of Jesus without





thinking of this first hand experience of neighbourly love.

Jesus considers neighbourly love to be of such importance that he affirms that all of God's commandments hang on those two principles: love God and love your neighbour. As a church, in our teaching on a Sunday, we have gone back to the life of Jesus in the Gospel of Luke. Through these pages of Luke's Gospel Jesus models to us what loving God should look like and what loving our neighbour, even those who oppose and ridicule Him, looks like. Jesus demonstrates that our love for people should flow from our love for God, because we love what God loves, and God loves everyone no matter who they are.

The challenge, however, is not in saying 'Love your neighbour', the challenge is putting it into action. Our late Queen in her 2017 Christmas Day speech said; "Christ's example helps me see the value of doing small things with great love." We have experienced small acts of great love since moving to Pirbright. This is something that we can all do. As I challenge myself today, I wonder for you is there a person, maybe someone who is not your friend, for who you could do a small act of great love?

I would love to meet with you. Please do come by one Sunday to our 9:30am service at St Michael's or get in touch to meet up.

MARCH GARDENING TIPS from Wellie

March can be a busy time in the garden, as Spring begins you will notice the busy activity of birds in your garden building their nests. To help them out tie up bunches of tiny twigs, moss and stringy plant material around your garden. Hedgehogs and frogs begin to come out of hibernation this month, make sure there is availability of water and food for them.

Lift and divide overgrown clumps of herbaceous perennials that were not split in the Autumn. Overcrowded clumps of snowdrops and winter aconites can be lifted and divided after they have finished flowering. Last chance to prune your wisteria

before it starts to grow. Prune roses by the end of the month before the new buds get too big. Coppice Cornus and Salix to stimulate colourful young stems for next winter. Protect blossoms of apricots, peaches and nectarines from late frosts by covering with fleece. Hardy annuals such as Calendula, Cornflower, Larkspur, Nigella, Poached egg plant (Limnanthes) and Californian poppies can be sown directly at the end of the month. Sow lettuce, rocket, carrots, peas and early potatoes outside when the soil

> has warmed up. Sow parsnip now. As they are erratic germinators, sow them in clusters of 3 or 4 seeds, 15cm apart. Sow cucumbers, melons and tomatoes inside.
