So here we are in June. Trees are at their greenest, all around us we have colour: in our gardens, in the parks and fields. It's a time of growth. No doubt we're looking forward to some warm weather, holidays, BBQs and all the other good things that we enjoy in June – not forgetting the Village Fair on the 17th of course!

June marks the turning point in the year with the longest day on the 21st. The days are long, the nights are short. The sun shines (well, most of the time, anyway...). Light rules, OK!

At certain times, though, that life-enriching light can be a little *too* bright, and we reach for our sun-hats and sunglasses to shield us from its glare. But we can't shut it out alto-

gether, and even in the darkest days of winter most of us will hold off doing things unless we can do them in the few short hours of daylight, or unless we have decent lighting to guide us. And of course we have to share that light with the rest of the world; let's not forget that when we're in darkness there are others **Around the**World who are bathed in light. The sun never sets on the world we call home.

Among the most uplifting and popular songs we sing in church are several that talk about light: 'This Little Light of Mine'; 'Lord the Light of Your Love (Shine, Jesus Shine); 'Colours of Day'; 'Light of the World' (Here I Am to Worship); 'Like a Candle Flame' (The Candle Song)...

In John's Gospel, Jesus says, 'I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness but will have the light of life'. So this June, let's enjoy and celebrate the summer's warmth and light. But remember also that God's light, the promise of the light of life, will never leave us.

It is carved at the head of a plaque displaying a document of 1574 by Stephen Remnant gifting his two sons a property called 'Edydyns in Pyrbright' & was discovered recently in an antique centre. Not only is there no record of the name for at least 270 years, but also it was almost certainly part of the Manor of Cowshot, for which no records survive, where the Remnants were Big Cheeses in the time of Good Queen Bess (1st). Over 45s – make a date in your diary for the Jean Seager Tournament on Saturday 22nd July. Watch out for further information.



JUNE GARDENING TIPS from Wellie

Harvest early peas, and prepare for a late sowing to get an autumn crop. Thin fruit, especially apples and plums for bigger fruit, less biennial bearing and fewer broken branches. Sow lettuces and radishes to fill in any gaps between slower maturing vegetables such as brassicas. Net soft fruit bushes to stop the birds taking the fruit. Sow overwintering carrots, such as Autumn King'. Plant out leeks when they are pencil thick. Make a deep hole with a dibber and drop the leek into the hole, if the roots are very long they can be trimmed to roughly 2cm, do not push the soil around the plant, just pour water into the hole and let the earth fall around the plant. Put out fresh water for birds. Feeding them dry food such as stale bread can hasten birds' dehydration. Ensure birdbaths are always full of clean water in hot spells. Leave out food for hedgehogs and

badgers if they visit your garden. In the churchvard we have started to build a bug hotel and brush pile to provide a refuge and shelter for small animals. Regularly mow lawns, mowing in different directions to prevent wear patterns and to encourage upright growth. A highnitrogen summer lawn fertilizer can be applied if there isn't drought conditions. Herbaceous plants can still be staked now, if they require some extra support. Tie in shoots of climbing and rambling roses horizontally as possible to encourage better flowering. Protect plants from slugs and snails. Cut down oriental poppies to ground level after they have flowered, and they will send up new foliage. Check roses for signs of blackspot, aphids and leaf rolling sawfly damage. Cut down daffodil bulbs now as it has

been at least 6 weeks since they flowered. Deadhead camellias and rhododendrons. Divide bearded irises after flowering.
