PIRBRIGHT HISTORIANS

Another exciting find! Discovered by Parish Clerk, Helen, cuttings of parish history written in 24 instalments for the Parish Magazine, with handwritten additions. Cue for some delving, as we'd not come across the author in Pirbright. William Maurice Adams was hern in Wiltehirs in 1849, became a schoolmacter, and came to live



born in Wiltshire in 1848, became a schoolmaster, and came to live at Victoria Villas, Connaught Road with wife Georgiana & two daughters c1908-11. Luckily, we have some Magazine copies for 1910 to confirm these were indeed his articles, though they weren't signed. We knew from Miss Cawthorn's book that Rev. Owston (Vicar 1851-88) had



compiled History Notes, which are now missing, so we've found many new insights into village history. Adams also added some verse of his own, a touch flowery to modern ears. An excerpt -

'Oh! Reader, if thou art inclined To make perchance an easy search. A mystic meaning thou mays't find In this my Tale of Pirbright Church!'

DECEMBER GARDENING TIPS from Wellie

Keep raking up those leaves from the lawn and borders. From now until the end of March is the time to plant any bare rooted trees, shrubs and roses. For fresh herbs, pot up mint and chives to 'force' on the kitchen windowsill. Earth up tall Brussel sprout stems to support them against winter winds. Cut back your asparagus ferns when they have turned yellow, and put a layer of well rotted compost on top of the crowns. Clear paths of moss

and lichen so that they are not a slip hazard (elf 'n' safety!) Check that there isn't any fuel left in your garden machinery before storing over winter, as stale fuel is often the reason why a mower will not start at the beginning of the following season, and book it in for a service, all ready for next Spring. Clean, oil and sharpen your tools, and sharpen your hoe hoe hoe. Wash and disinfect bird feeders and tables, clean out bird baths. Hang fat balls and make sure feeders are kept topped up. Make a pile of old logs in a corner of your garden to provide shelter for
