Army Training Centre (Pirbright) comes to Pirbright Village Green for Armed Forces Day

On 29th June, to celebrate Armed Forces Day, the village Green will play host to the Army Training Centre (Pirbright). There will be an Army-themed obstacle course, bouncy castles, cam-cream face painting and games including inflatable sumo suits and tug of war finale. All activities will be free of charge and organised in partnership with the Parish Council and personnel from the Army Training Centre, Pirbright (ATC (P)). The event will be opened by the Commandant of the Soldier Academy and attended by Senior Military personnel from ATC (P) and the Mayor of Guildford. We are fortunate that a number of local businesses are providing sponsorship to significantly enhance the event. There will be a range of information tents around the green for you to visit, many with activities or displays including a captivating Ghurkha experience, the Military Wives Choir from the Royal Military Academy Sandhurst, Brookwood Primary School Choir and the Army Medical Services (AMS) Marching Band. There will also be a variety of catering vans in attendance. Free visitor parking will be available in Lawson's field.

PIRBRIGHT HISTORIANS

Bakersgate is one of very few 15th century buildings in Pirbright which survive today. Unsurprisingly, it is a Grade II listed building. Several generations of the original Baker family - each named John Baker - farmed 100+ acres there for over 300 years, but the family left Pirbright in 1798, at the start of the Napoleonic Wars. The photo is of the Slaughter family at the house in 1871. Notable owners from 1928 onwards were Charles Lyle, the 2nd Baron Lyle of Westbourne, and his wife Joyce. He was a grandson of Abram Lyle, who had created Lyle's Golden Syrup in the 1880s, with its distinctive lion and bees symbol - the world's oldest surviving brand apparently (but under threat from this year's rebranding exercise at the company). Charles and Joyce were well-known in Pirbright and lived in Bakersgate in some style until Charles's death in 1976. Joyce remarried and remained at Bakersgate until 1983. MAY GARDENING TIPS from Wellie

Hoe borders to remove weed seedlings. Mow lawns regularly now, apply a weed, feed and moss treatment if not already done. Sow lawns or lay turf. Spray paths for weeds. Prune spring-flowering shrubs such as Choisya and Ribes after flowering. Check for nesting birds before trimming any hedges. Tie in climbing and rambling roses as near to horizontal as possible. Tie in shoots of clematis and sweet peas as they climb. Trim back Alyssum, winter flowering heathers and Aubrieta after flowering to encourage fresh growth. Plant out summer bedding towards the end of the month, after all risk of frost have gone. Watch out for slug and snail damage. Did you know that there are over 40 different types of slugs in the UK but only a few of them actually cause damage to our plants. Watch out for viburnum and lily beetle grubs. Keep earthing up potatoes, and plant any that are still remaining. Put straw around strawberry plants, then net to protect fruit from hungry birds. French and runner beans, and sweetcorn, can be sown outside now. Start removing side shoots from the leaf axils of cordon tomatoes. Hang pheromone traps in apple trees to check for codling moths.
