### Parish Council Finances

It is budget time for the Parish Council and it must submit its request for funds to GBC. These funds are ultimately paid by you, the parishioners for the services that the Parish Council provide. These include the maintenance of the village green. sports field and pond, trees and both village car parks and the popular village playground. The council must pay a parttime Clerk and subscribe to council bodies who are regulated by the LGA. The council must pay for internal and external auditors to ensure its accounts are in order and this fund also pays for the projects that the Council undertakes each year to maintain the village, such as the de-silting of the pond and restoring the Grade II listed war memorial. The Parish must now pay for the village green litter bins to be emptied and previously available grants have been removed. With all this in mind. Councillors considered the Council's requirement to provide essential services whilst being mindful of the on-going cost pressures our parishioners are facing and the need to enhancing our reserves to maintain the Council's assets, a budget amount of £87,820 was agreed and requested.

The amount represents a 3.5% increase on last year but Cllr Woollett, Chair of the Council, was adamant that keeping the increase at a modest level was also important. With this in mind the Parish Council will not seek to undertake any high value projects without an outside funding stream during the financial year 2025-26 and as Chair of the Trustees for the Village Hall, Cllr Woollett also suggested that a working party should be formed to consider plans for the longterm maintenance of the beloved village hall which is now over 100 years old and starting to show its age, starting with a structural survey to feed into future years' financial planning. The Parish Council will go into detail at its annual Parish Assembly on 21/04/25 and parishioners are encouraged to attend to learn more

about where and how the Parish's money is spent. The evening event at the Community Sports Pavilion will be fairly informal to encourage residents to attend and feel included in the decision making process of their Parish

### PIRBRIGHT HISTORIANS

Unusually for such a small village, the Pirbright area had 3 functioning mills from early days: Pirbright Mill (1302), Heath Mill (1516), and Rickford Mill (1680). The dates are the earliest references we know of. Pirbright Mill had the prime location as it was upstream of the others, and could therefore control the flow of water. These mills were a prime source of flour for the locals for 500 years or more. Each mill had (and still has) a large mill house close by. But during the 20th century, watermills

became largely obsolete across England, thanks to cheaper electricity. Our 3 mills stopped operating between 1930 and 1960, and each was developed into

### GARDENING TIPS FOR FEBRUARY

Last opportunity to carry out winter pruning on apple and pear trees. Cut autumn raspberry canes to ground level ensuring you leave no stumps that could harbour disease. Prune out a quarter of blackcurrant older growth at ground level. Apply a general purpose fertiliser to tree, bush and cane fruit and mulch with well-rotted manure or garden compost. Force rhubarb by covering the crown with straw or leaves then cover with a bucket or dustbin with ventilation holes or a purpose made rhubarb pot to have early sticks in March.

Clean out existing bird boxes or put up new boxes, continue to provide food and keep bird baths topped up with fresh water.

In late February cut back ornamental grasses and other perennials left for winter interest. Prune back shrubs hard such as Cornus and Salix grown for winter coloured stems. Top dress beds and borders with a balanced fertiliser.

Cut back late flowering (group 3) Clematis such as Clematis viticella, C. orientalis and C. "Jackmannii" to a low pair of strong buds. Prune late summer flowering shrubs such as buddleia, lavatera and fuchsia hard.

Once winter flowering heathers have finished flowering, trim back with shears.
