Works at The Pirbright Institute

Gardening tips for April

Check roses for blackspot, remove any infected leaves and treat with a fungicide. Sow hardy annuals and wildflowers in gaps in the garden. Feed borders with a general purpose fertiliser such as Growmore and mulch with compost or well rotted manure. Plant summer bulbs such as alliums, eucomis and lillies. Cut back Penstemons now. Take a close look before pruning, some produce a mass of new shoots at the base of the plant, so old stems should be cut back close to the soil. When new growth is visible only along the stems, trim them to 15-20cm from the ground, just above a shoot. To encourage bushy growth on Marguerites, Pelargoniums and Fuchsias in the greenhouse, pinch out the tips. Spray weeds on driveways and paths this month when they are actively growing. Use a spring/summer feed on the lawn (it should be high in nitrogen to encourage strong leafy green swards) Carry on sowing vegetables directly into prepared soil including carrots, turnip, peas, broadbeans, spinach and lettuce. Sow tender couraettes, cucumbers and pumpkins in a heated propagator or sunny window sill. Plant out autumn sown sweet peas.

Soil on the Village Green

Concerns have been raised in the community about the continuing state of the village green following the dredging of the duck pond. Given the cost of removing the silt, it was felt that it could be put to use to improve the soil. Following discussions with the Horticultural Society, a proposal has emerged to take advantage of the increased fertility of the green for cultivation. The soil ridges are perfect for growing potatoes, ready for harvest in the autumn. Funds raised from the sale of the crop will help to pay for other community resources, with the advertising slogan 'Pirtatoes - Super Surrey Spuds'. Given global warming and the increasingly wet winters, the Little Green has been earmarked for growing rice. Planting begins on April 1st
