Call to Ordination

Joanna's background

My faith has always been the driving force in my life. I have been involved in numerous church activities over the years but particularly love to come alongside people to encourage them in their walk with God, and to ensure that in any group, people feel welcome and valued. I grew up in a Christian home and always knew that I wanted to serve God in some capacity. When I was 18, I re-committed my life to God and knew that I wanted to serve him in full-time ministry of some description. Before getting ordained I worked in marketing and research for a variety of businesses and charities. The last business I worked for provided safety and medical services to businesses working in post-conflict and remote areas around the world. I worked with local lawyers to register our business in these countries and sourced local business partners for us to work with.

In 2021 Alex had already felt a strong call to ordination and had spoken to our vicar about it when our curate asked me if I had ever considered ordination. I simply couldn't stop thinking about it and I had a very strong sense of everything falling into place and how the idea of ordination made all of my previous experiences make sense.

Both Alex and I went through the 'discernment process', the Anglican process for ascertaining whether or not someone is called to the priesthood. After nine months, numerous application forms, conversations, and a myriad of interviews, we were both approved for training and moved to Ripon College Cuddesdon theological college just outside Oxford where we trained full-time for two years.

Alexander's background

Similarly to Joanna, I was raised in a Christian household. My father was Anglican high church and my mother is Catholic. I grew up with a feeling that God wanted something from me and the idea of becoming a priest floated a round in my head all my life to a greater or lesser degree, but I kept running away from the calling, seeking to fulfil my own goals and satisfactions in life. Eventually, after years of avoiding the subject, I decided to approach my local vicar to discuss God's calling in my life. Having met Joanna, gotten married and had our daughter, I felt I was finally ready to answer God's call and begin my 'discernment process'. Joanna and I finished our time at theological college and have come to Pirbright and Wyke parishes to train with George for our curacies.

Curacy

Vicars are given the 'cure of souls' of the parishes they are responsible for. . This is a beautiful concept that the priest has a precious and extraordinary ministry to care for all the individuals in their community.



Curates help the vicar in caring for the souls of the parish.

We are doing a 50/50 job share in this curacy, both working part-time. Curacy is a training period of approximately three years where curates are trained by a vicar in how to minister as a priest. The Church of England ordains curates first as deacons, then after one year, ordains them again as priests. The theology behind this is to ensure that ministry is grounded in service (the role of a deacon is to serve the parish and community). We will both be ordained as priests at 10:30 on Saturday 28th June at Guildford Cathedral.

The duck house on the pond had seen better days and so the Parish Council engaged a Pirbright craftsman to design and build a new one. The result was a scaled version of the Green Hut, that sits adjacent to the Hall, complete with corrugated iron roof and veranda.

This was gratefully received although weighing in the region of 200kg it was not going to be an easy task to get it from the banks of the pond to the island. The Clerk enlisted 4 strong chaps and the trusty Hall Manager but even so, the new build was just too heavy to carry across the water. Thinking caps went on and the Clerk's double inflatable guest mattress was retrieved from her loft and brought onto the Green. The new Duck House was strapped to the top of the inflated mattress and was floated out to the island with no problem at all.





It is hoped that the new accommodation will meet with the approval of the resident wildfowl and will last as long as the last one. The island itself was constructed by Jim and Frank Rice and of course the 2 bronze ducks on the island, sitting close to the veranda of the new house,

were installed in memory of Jim and Freda Rice many moons ago.

The Council would like to thank Steve Mitchell for his amazing design and craftsmanship. The Clerk would like to thank Nigel Emmerson, Catherine & Johannes Loots and Gavin & Josh Myers for donning waders and providing the muscle to get the new house to the island.

July Gardening tips

This month focus on maintaining your garden, encouraging further blooms and preparing for harvesting. Divide congested clumps of bearded iris after flowering. Dead head bedding plants, sweet peas, roses and herbaceous plants to encourage more flowers.

Trim evergreen hedges, including conifers, (but still just check for nesting birds first). Feed dahlias and cannas every two weeks with a high potassium fertilizer, such as tomato feed.

Prune early-summer flowering shrubs, such as Philadelphus, once they have finished flowering. Cut back flowered growth to a strong lower shoot and thin out up to a fifth of old, woody stems. Cut back hardy geraniums to ground level after they have had their first flush of flowers to encourage new foliage and more flowers later in the year.

Fruit trees and bushes need a lot of extra water to support developing fruit. Pinch out climbing beans when they reach the top of their supports. Water courgettes consistently so they continue to crop well. Keep tomatoes well watered to prevent blossom end rot.

Regularly check for pests like aphids, spider mites and caterpillars. Consider using eco-friendly methods and introducing beneficial insects like ladybirds. Keep bird baths topped up.
