## WHO DOES WHAT?

Parish Council Responsibilities - it can be confusing to know which council is responsible for what services in the village.

Parish and town councils are part of local government in Northamptonshire together with Northamptonshire County Council and East Northants District Council. Each is responsible for different things.

Your Parish Council is responsible for - seats and benches, the village noticeboards, the telephone kiosks, and the Achurch war memorial.

The District Council is responsible for local services including housing, local planning, environmental health and refuse collections.

The County Council is responsible for strategic services such as highways, education, libraries, social services, strategic planning and refuse disposal.

Highway problems - if you wish to report problems such as potholes, overgrown verges, or problems with footpaths, you can report on line at: <a href="http://www.northamptonshire.gov.uk/streetdoctor">http://www.northamptonshire.gov.uk/streetdoctor</a>. Problems with the yellow grits bins should also be reported to NCC but issues concerning the red bin at Lilford must be reported to the Clerk.

## WHAT LWTA PC ACHIEVED DURING 2018

**PLANNING** – commented on 8 planning application taking residents views into consideration.

**BUS SERVICE** – gave support to a scheme to help fund the Call Connect bus service. Unfortunately sufficient support was not pledged to allow the proposals to be carried out.

**BANK CLOSURE** – made representation to Barclays expressing concerns over closure.

**CONSULTATIONS** – responded to consultation documents re local government reform (Unitary Authority). Responded to East Northamptonshire Draft Local Plan Part 2 consultation document.

**HIGHWAYS/RIGHTS OF WAY** – approached landowners where footpaths have become overgrown. Reported potholes and other damage to NCC Street Doctor.

**WIGSTHORPE** – the bench was installed near to the BT kiosk several months ago and hopefully has proved to be a suitable resting place for those walking the nearby Nene Way as well as for local residents.

**ACHURCH** – gave consideration to speed reduction methods (village gates, Visual Speed Indicator Sign on the Thorpe – Achurch road including lobbying NCC (unsuccessfully) for a 30 mph limit through Achurch.

**LILFORD** – contacted County Councillor and MP re roll out of fast Broad Band. Successfully applied for a grant of £100 towards the cost of a defibrillator.

**THORPE** — repair work has been carried out by Councillors to the benches and to the village sign. Currently the Parish Council is working with ENC to try to get a litter bin installed in the layby on the A605 in the hope that those using the layby will place their rubbish in the bin instead of leaving it in the layby and adjacent area. Considered a request from residents, and consulted ENC, for the provision and installation of street name signs. Approached NCC on several occasions expressing residents concerns re the speed of traffic on the A605, and the condition of the soft verges.
