This an invitation from The Friends and Supporters of Marie Curie, Newcastle to join The Yellow Ribbon Walk on 13th May to remember family and friends.

We are raising money for a new family unit at the Marie Curie Centre. The Yellow Ribbon Walk is for all ages and abilities and takes place at **Kirkharle Courtyard starting at 2pm**. There are three routes through lovely countryside that once inspired Capability Brown:

- 5k guided circular walk along the old coach road and farm tracks
- 1.5k shorter walk
- 1k lakeside path with nature trail.

We are hoping to raise as much as possible to fund a new, self contained unit allowing terminally ill patients to be cared for by hospice staff with their families around them. A similar one opened in 2013, funded by the Friends, is the only facility in the north east and is in continuous use. The project is a priority and costs $\pounds 60,000$.

To join the walk, a fee of £10 for an adult, £5 for 6-16 year olds and £20 for a family of 4, covers administrative costs, and participants are asked to invite sponsorship to help cover us reaching our target. Please come and enjoy a walk in the countryside!
