The Basketball Court – an update

Last autumn, the Village Hall Committee realised that the 'Basketball Court' was in a state of disrepair. A group of young people signed a petition asking for the fence to be replaced and to bring it back into a useful community area. The school, Brownies and Holiday Club were also asked for their thoughts. Outcome: everyone agreed it needed sorting out. After a long and protracted process, we applied for funding (still waiting to hear), RH Irving of Matfen leant their considerable support, as did Cllr Veronica Jones and the school. Planning permission has now been granted. Once funding is in place, we can start work. **However**, during the Village Hall clean-up, we found that the court had broken glass on it, making it extremely dangerous to use, and fires had been lit. New Cultural Fund for Northumberland now live

- A new cultural fund for event organisers in Northumberland is now live for applications.
- The Northumberland Cultural Fund went live on May 1st following approval by Northumberland County Council. The deadline for applications is Mon May 13, at 5pm
- The fund will support event organisers in the delivery of their new event taking place this summer.
- The fund will allow organisations and individuals to develop their new event to create a packed summer of events for 2019.
- Events organisers would be able to bid for a share of the £100,000 fund and it is anticipated that it will be used for small projects, aimed at supporting the programme of County wide activities and would not be intended to fund large scale events.
- Applications can be made for events in any creative genre, by a constituted group, charity or Not for Profit organisation but the fund cannot be used to fund 100% of the event.







* The hall is in a poor state of repair and needs urgent and essential work to the roof and both gable ends. The wooden window frames, particularly those in the West Room facing the Village Green, have started to rot and need replacing.

* The facilities need bringing up to date.

* There is not enough money in the kitty to do this essential work.

The Stamfordham Playing Field & Village Hall charity, which owns the hall, is asking for your help.

With this copy of the Stamfordham Communicator you will find a letter explaining how the Stamfordham Playing Field & Village Hall charity is funded and what you could do to help.
