

#### **Christmas Shoe Boxes 2019**



## Churchyard Rules

The Churchyard rules and guidelines for St. Mary's Stamfordham, Holy Trinity Matfen and All Saints Ryal have been reviewed by the PCCs. The churchyard rules are quite detailed, and largely determined by the Diocese of Newcastle. They are needed because a churchyard is a public space which is used by many people.

We know how important it is to have a place to mourn someone you have loved. It's natural to want to make your loved ones grave personal. But what one person finds beautiful and consoling, someone else may find intrusive and distressing. The rules aim to ensure that, as far as possible, the appearance of graves is acceptable to everyone and in harmony with the rest of the churchyard.

You can find full copies of the rules and guidelines on the noticeboards of all three churches. Please note that mourners have always been encouraged to plant early spring bulbs on a grave and that fresh flowers have always been welcomed, if they are in a vase on the base of the headstone or in a purpose built vase which is part of the headstone. "Private Gardens" have never been permitted and that planting in a grave or placing of pots on a grave is not allowed.

In line with the global move to eradicate plastic, people are requested to have no plastic of any kind or artificial flowers and that from next summer, it is expected that all of the Rules and Guidelines will be followed and that there will be no planting in the ground or pots, other than early spring bulbs. Our churches and churchyards are open every day and we welcome all visitors. Please help us to keep our churchyards looking beautiful and natural for all who visit.




