Make a real difference to people with sight loss...

By collecting stamps you're helping to break down the barriers that stop people with sight loss living life to the full. RNIB accept all stamps: new or used, first or second class, foreign, first day covers, presentation packs or albums. Stamps are sold by weight and they raise £20 per kilogram of stamps, so it's a brilliant way to raise money.

Friends of mine have kindly been collecting stamps and dropping them off with me – see attached photos to see how quickly a pile can grow (weight: 327g), all ready to send off to RNIB. So thought I would let everyone in the village know about it, happy for anyone to pop a pack of used stamps through the door at 34 Grange Road. I won't be sending stamps off again for a while, so you have plenty of time to save some. In fact may just send a reminder out before next Christmas!

Maybe you could save stamps at work, perhaps mention to your colleagues, friends, family. Either way, hopefully the next time I send a package off to them (probably not until much later this year) it could be heavier than 327g!

The 1st Ponteland Boys' Brigade engages weekly with more than 18 young people. Giving them opportunities to meet together in their sections and enjoy a range of fun and developing activities. We give them opportunities not normally found elsewhere, such as: Camps - To Northern Ireland and Scotland The Queens badge - The highest award possible to achieve in the Boys' Brigade Broomley Grange - A Boys' Brigade retreat D of E award scheme Gordon Bullous Memorial Award

The boys get the chance to develop existing skills and learn new ones, through a fun, balanced and challenging programme of activities, the Company section programme called 'Discover' based on three areas; community, recreation and skills, and Senior Section programme is 'Challenge +'. The Boys are encouraged to have a say and help shape their own programme. This time the Boys chose to make eight bird nesting boxes as part of the community and conservation aspects of their programme.

The boys within the Company and Senior sections spent a soggy morning on Sunday 2nd February, over at Clark's Bog, a private nature reserve just outside of Morpeth, with Peter Matthewson, Reserve Warden.

The boys worked very hard and enjoyed being able to install their boxes on the trees around the reserve. During their visit they helped the owner with some small tasks, and assisted with the construction of an island which is going in the middle of the pond that is being built on the site. Peter explained to the boys all about the wildlife that has been seen within the reserve, which included, Roe Deer, Red and Grey Squirrels, Badgers, Foxes, Voles, Rats, a vast array of Birds including a wonderful Heron and some pheasants.

1st Ponteland BB - established over 50 years ago - makes an appeal for new members to counter a slide in membership, falling from over 40 boys to 18. The group is open to five-to-18 year-olds and is split into four sections which meet on Tuesday nights during term time at Ponteland Methodist Church. 'Anchors', aged five to eight, meet from 6.00pm to 7.00pm, while the 'Juniors' aged 8 to 11, 'Company' aged 11 to 15, and 'Seniors', aged 15 to 18, all meet from 7pm to 8.45pm.
