Firstly, this is not a public right of way and secondly, despite notices being posted at both points of entry regarding dogs, they are just ignored. The owners are letting the dogs do their business and not even picking it up. This is a sports ground where people are sliding around on the grass during games of football and cricket. Both cricket and football teams have to check the field before commencement of play. Also, the cutting machinery becomes infected by the dog mess so that when maintenance on blades is done, it has to be cleaned and disinfected before work can start. As many of you will know, Friday 8th May at 3:00 pm is the 75th Anniversary of Victory in Europe.

Because of the Coronavirus and subsequent lock-down restrictions, the planned national celebrations have had to be cancelled. However, with everyone's co-operation, it will still be possible for this Anniversary to be celebrated in Stamfordham.

Friday 8th May

To comply with the no crowds and social distancing guidance, we would respectfully request that no-one visits St Mary's Churchyard between 2:45- 3:05 pm on Friday 8th May. During this period, within the Churchyard, our bugler (James Freeman-Griffith) and our piper (David Jones) will, at a safe distance, be playing near the war graves. This will be being filmed, again from a safe distance, and transmitted 'Live' via the 'Stamfordham Matters and COVID Support' Facebook Page. This will lead into the Nation's Toast to the Heroes of WW2, followed by David piping through the village.

The timings are as follows:

2:55- The bugler will play 'The Last Post'

3:00- The piper will play 'Battles O'er' and a specially written tune called 'VE 75 Years'

3:00- While the pipes are playing, we would encourage you all to take part in the Nation's Toast to the Heroes of WW2. 'FOR THOSE THAT GAVE SO MUCH, WE THANK YOU'. You can do this at your front door, in your garden, basically anywhere, however please be safe.

3:05- David will then pipe through the village, starting from outside the Church Yard and finishing at Bridge End. Please note that it will take about 8-9 minutes to pipe through the village.

Sunday 10th May

11:00- The 'Tribute to the Millions' will be read by Revd Rachel Scheffer. This will again be filmed from a safe distance and transmitted 'Live' via the 'Stamfordham Matters and COVID Support' Facebook Page.

We hope you will all find a way to get involved in these celebrations however we must again insist that there are no gatherings at the Churchyard and that everyone complies with the social distancing guidelines.

From the NFU: Advice for walkers, particularly in these times

When walking with dogs in fields with cattle, the advice is to avoid getting between cows and their calves; to keep your dog under close and effective control on a lead around cows and sheep, but not to hang onto your dog if you are threatened by cattle - let it go and allow the dog to run to safety.

This offers the best chance of a safe outcome to both you and your dog. If you feel threatened by animals protecting their territory or young, do not run. Move to the edge of the field and, if possible, find another way round.

Northumberland celebrates as county tops the winners at awards

Northumberland found reason to celebrate today as the county topped the list of winners at this year's North East England Tourism Awards.

The awards were announced online with judges from each category outlining the strengths of the winning applications in a show of support for the industry at this difficult time.

There were eight Gold winners from Northumberland, out of 15 categories, with the county once again having more winners than any other area in the region.

Winners included Falconry Days, of Simonburn, Hexham which picked up two awards in both the Small Visitor Attraction of the Year category and one of the new categories for this year - the International Tourism Award.

Matfen Hall was named Large Hotel of the Year and once again St Cuthbert's House in Seahouses picked up the Gold for B&B and Guest House of the Year and Seafield Caravan Park also in Seahouses was named Camping, Glamping and Holiday Park of the Year.

Other winners were South Tynedale Railway who won Gold in the Ethical, Responsible and Sustainable Tourism Award and The Apple Inn, in Lucker picked up the coveted Pub of the Year award.

And for the second year in a row St Oswald's Farm on Hadrian's Wall was named Self Catering Accommodation Provider of the Year.

Cllr Cath Homer, cabinet member for Culture, Arts, Leisure and Tourism at Northumberland County Council said: "I would like to congratulate all of our Northumberland winners. We know that it is a worrying time for our tourism industry and for all those businesses that add to our county's success. However it is these businesses and their continued passion and commitment who will help us to economic recovery once current restrictions are eased.

"As a council we are doing all we can to support businesses, particularly in the tourism industry through these difficult times by continuing to show why Northumberland is a destination of choice, and when the time is right, visitors will be welcomed back to our great county with open arms."




