"It's okay... he's friendly!"

No. It's not okay. If you see a dog on a leash - call your dog away.

If your off-lead dog doesn't have good enough recall to be called away from an on-leash dog - don't let them off and take the time to train them.

Please think about the other dogs, not just your own.

Dogs can be on-leash for all sorts of reasons, not just because they are fearful of other dogs. Some reasons to recall your dog away:

- recovering from surgery
- elderly / sick
- restricted exercise
- poor recall
- new rescue dog
- young puppy

Protect your dog: dogs who have poor recall can get into all sorts of trouble. If your dog is bitten (even just once) this could lead to your own dog becoming fearful.

COVID-19: SMS / Text message SCAMS

THREAT

The NCSC, alongside security researchers around the world, has warned users of SMS, email, and online scams using COVID-19 information as a lure. The NCSC warning lists the 'Top 4 SMS Scams' as following similar patterns: fake government (GOV.UK) links, lockdown fines, health supplements to protect against the virus, and financial support from the recipient's bank.

Scammers have launched numerous campaigns in the weeks since early December, looking to steal personal information, conduct identity theft, scam victims, and for potential financial gain. In the case of the scam leveraging the UK government, SMS were sent from UK Gov, rather than GOV.UK.









ADVICE

- Challenge Could it be fake? It's ok to reject, refuse or ignore any requests that don't feel right. Check GOV.UK to ensure it's genuine.
- Be wary of text messages that try to get you to send money, or important personal information such as bank details or passwords.
- Take a moment to stop and think before parting with information to keep you safe or your money.
- Use official government websites and refer to 'Contact Us' sections of websites to access information and services.

The Cyclone Festival of Cycling

.....is looking forward to making a return to its spiritual home, the village of Stamfordham, in early July. If the Government's plans to remove Coronavirus restrictions go to schedule, the Festival will once again bring cyclists of all ages and abilities back to the beautiful Northumberland countryside and its distinctive villages and nowhere is more synonymous with the festival than Stamfordham.

On Saturday 3 July, the village hall will be the focus of attention, with riders in the Cyclone's Challenge Rides, homing in on the food and drink that will be available for them. With four different routes (all passing through the village in their latter stages) the Challenge Rides bring in thousands of riders of all abilities, many of them raising money for charity. Stamfordham is their last official "feed" of the day and many will linger to enjoy the huge range of cakes, teas, sandwiches and snacks that the village hall volunteers put on.

This wonderful coming-together of hungry and thirsty riders and the matchless home baking skills of Stamfordham brings in a lot of welcome funding to the village hall.

Stamfordham will be at the hub of the action on the Sunday, 4th July, when it is the host village for the women's Curlew Cup and men's Beaumont Trophy races. Both events are part of British Cycling's national series and will feature professional riders who have competed at the highest level. Previous winners include Olympic medallists Bradley Wiggins and all-time Paralympic great, Sarah Storey.

The races start on the road in the village centre and take in multiple laps of a anti-clockwise loop to the North of the village. The village hall will again be an important component in the day's activities, acting as the HQ for the races and once again putting out food and drink all day long for hungry officials, riders and spectators.

Those spectators also fan out through the village and into the surrounding countryside, visiting pubs and shops and, in many cases, sampling the ice cream cart that is always parked at the top of the Ryals climb, a few miles up the road.

Cyclone organiser, Peter Harrison, is looking forward to July: "Having fallen victim to the pandemic in 2020, we have been determined to bring the Cyclone Festival of Cycling back in 2021. We have always been incredibly grateful for the support of the people of Stamfordham who allow us to take over their village for a weekend every year. This time we're looking forward to celebrating a return to normality with our many friends in the village and we'll be encouraging all our riders and spectators to come into the village and enjoy the hospitality its famous for!"


