

The Cyclone Festival of Cycling

.....is looking forward to making a return to its spiritual home, the village of Stamfordham, in early July. If the Government's plans to remove Coronavirus restrictions go to schedule, the Festival will once again bring cyclists of all ages and abilities back to the beautiful Northumberland countryside and its distinctive villages and nowhere is more synonymous with the festival than Stamfordham.

On Saturday 3 July, the village hall will be the focus of attention, with riders in the Cyclone's Challenge Rides, homing in on the food and drink that will be available for them. With four different routes (all passing through the village in their latter stages) the Challenge Rides bring in thousands of riders of all abilities, many of them raising money for charity. Stamfordham is their last official "feed" of the day and many will linger to enjoy the huge range of cakes, teas, sandwiches and snacks that the village hall volunteers put on.

This wonderful coming-together of hungry and thirsty riders and the matchless home baking skills of Stamfordham brings in a lot of welcome funding to the village hall.

Stamfordham will be at the hub of the action on the Sunday, 4th July, when it is the host village for the women's Curlew Cup and men's Beaumont Trophy races. Both events are part of British Cycling's national series and will feature professional riders who have competed at the highest level. Previous winners include Olympic medallists Bradley Wiggins and all-time Paralympic great, Sarah Storey.

The races start on the road in the village centre and take in multiple laps of a anti-clockwise loop to the North of the village. The village hall will again be an important component in the day's activities, acting as the HQ for the races and once again putting out food and drink all day long for hungry officials, riders and spectators.

Those spectators also fan out through the village and into the surrounding countryside, visiting pubs and shops and, in many cases, sampling the ice cream cart that is always parked at the top of the Ryals climb, a few miles up the road.

Cyclone organiser, Peter Harrison, is looking forward to July: "Having fallen victim to the pandemic in 2020, we have been determined to bring the Cyclone Festival of Cycling back in 2021. We have always been incredibly grateful for the support of the people of Stamfordham who allow us to take over their village for a weekend every year. This time we're looking forward to celebrating a return to normality with our many friends in the village and we'll be encouraging all our riders and spectators to come into the village and enjoy the hospitality its famous for!"

Northumberland gets set to 'change gear'

Northumberland County Council is asking residents to slow down and 'change gear' as part of a new campaign to encourage more people to ditch their cars in favour of walking and cycling.

'The Big Northumberland Gear Change' is the council's battle-cry to save the environment and health of residents by encouraging people to adopt more sustainable ways of getting around the county.

Packed with tips, advice and stories from fellow residents who have swapped petrol for pedals, a dedicated new website has been developed to convince residents to reduce their reliance on cars, which is crucial to achieving Northumberland's net zero carbon emissions target by 2030.

Stuart McNaughton, Strategic Transport Manager at Northumberland County Council said:

"With lockdown measures starting to ease and many people looking to continue the good habits they formed when their cars were not needed as much, there is no better time for Northumberland residents to lead the way and commit to an ongoing change in their travel habits.

"With only 13% of all journeys in Northumberland made on foot or by bike and with a third of all trips made in the county less than 5km, there is plenty of potential for us all to ditch the car some of the time in favour of healthier, greener and happier ways of getting around.

"Our campaign is not asking residents to become an endurance cyclist or the next coast-tocoast finisher, we are simply asking people to take an honest look if there are ways to leave the car at home and walk and cycle more often in exchange.

"The sun is shining, the birds are singing, so let's slow down, change gear and get out there to fully enjoy the best county in England!"

Sandra Kerr who stars in one of the campaign films that shows her getting around Warkworth on her electric bike with her partner David, said:

"Whenever we take off on our electric bikes, it's customary for me to say 'It's good to be back in the saddle' (groans from my cycling companion). But it's true; cycling is good for health and well -being, great for exploring our lovely county and finding its secret beauties, and it does no harm to our extraordinary planet. So it doesn't 'cost the Earth!"
