New website brings history to life for pupils

Schoolchildren across Northumberland will now be able to view a range of important archives online thanks to a new website.

The Learning and Educational Archives Resources from Northumberland (LEARN) website has been developed by Northumberland Archives, thanks to a £5k grant from The National Archives.

The digital learning platform was developed with the help of nine schools in the county who were part of a pilot scheme to test the site and develop content.

Created using documents from the archives the platform focuses on archives relating to four themes:

Crime & Punishment Victorians World War I World War II

Each theme includes suggested resources, lesson plans and activities for teachers to download and use in class. The project is aimed at Key Stage 2 to life-long learners.

There is also an option for users to upload their own resources, including examples of students' work and lessons plans as inspiration for others.

Sue Wood, Head of Archives said: "This has been a first for the archives team to work collaboratively with schools to create something which can help bring history to life for teachers and learners.

"We have worked really closely with them to understand the type of documents which would be useful and are now able to provide them in an easy to access way to benefit pupils in their learning."

The Duchess's Community High School, Alnwick was one of the schools who took part in the pilot scheme. Rosie Bush, Culture and Community Co-ordinator at the school said: "The LEARN website provides excellent resources and lesson ideas which can be tailored for a wide variety of year groups.

"Using archived materials has brought lessons alive and made teaching big topics more relevant and localised for our young people."

Unlocking Northumberland's archives

Northumberland Archives and Northumberland Libraries have teamed up with the University of East Anglia (UEA) in an exciting new project to unlock rare and fascinating collections.

The <u>Unlocking the Archive</u> project aims to make historic books more accessible in new and exciting ways while educating people about the history of the books and their content.

Northumberland Archives approached the team at the UEA's School of Literature Drama and Creative Writing to offer up some of the county's oldest and most rare collections to be made available online as part of the project.

The chosen archives come from the Northumberland Libraries Local Studies Collections and includes:

Magna Britannia (the Northumberland section) by Thomas Cox (published in 1720) The Hermit of Warkworth by Thomas Percy (published in 1806) The Fables of Aesop by Thomas Bewick (published in 1823) The History of Alnwick by William Davison (published in 1813) Leges Marchiarum by William Nicolson (published in 1705)

This the first project of its kind for Northumberland Archives and Northumberland Libraries in digitising their printed Local Studies stock and making them available online. Excerpts from the books are featured on the project website, where visitors can learn more about the books and their context by clicking interactive hot points. The originals are available to view at Northumberland Archives Study Centre at Woodhorn.

Sue Wood, Head of Archives for Northumberland said: "We approached the team at UEA as we felt we had a number of important collections that could add impact to this project.

"Northumberland has a rich selection of rare, printed books in the Northumberland Libraries collection and to have these available online, to a wider audience is a first for our archives.

"Now more people will be able to discover our history and heritage. We hope this will be the start of a great partnership between us and the University."

Dr Sophie Butler, Lecturer in Early Modern Literature, School of Literature, Drama and Creative Writing, at UEA said: "We had been looking at ways of expanding the Unlocking the Archive project so we've been delighted by the opportunity to work with Northumberland which has allowed us to broaden our project's reach considerably.

"Northumberland has such an important part to play in the history of the book, with many of the examples in their collection showing the contribution the county made to publishing in the 18th and 19th Century. The beautiful Thomas Bewick book chosen for this project is a great example of that.

"Unlocking the Archive helps to bring these important documents to life and offers people a different way of exploring these rare collections. We're thrilled to be launching this partnership during Local History Month, as we hope it will provide all kinds of new ways for individuals and communities to access Northumberland's written heritage now and in the future."

The Unlocking the Archive project has been nominated in UEA's Innovation and Impact Awards in the Outstanding Social or Cultural Impact category.




