





CHAIR YOGA TASTER SESSIONS

Hello, I'm Dharma, a Yoga & Mindfulness Teacher living in Wallridge, currently running yoga classes in the Northumberland area – including a Gentle Yoga class at Stamfordham Village Hall.

I am fully qualified with many years' experience delivering a range of training and adult education. I am also a certified Accessible Yoga Teacher.

I will be setting up a Chair Yoga class at the village hall in January and just thought it might be nice to write a little piece for the Communicator on what yoga is and what chair yoga is.

WHAT IS YOGA AND WHAT IS CHAIR YOGA?

The NHS website describes Yoga as 'an ancient form of exercise that focuses on strength, flexibility and breathing to boost physical and mental wellbeing' (<u>A guide to yoga - NHS (www.nhs.uk)</u>). It's a wonderful, gentle way to exercise our bodies as well as calm the mind and offer relief from the tension and stress of everyday life.

Chair Yoga is simply yoga that we practice either on a chair or using a chair as a prop.

Using a chair makes this wonderfully beneficial practice accessible to many more people – including many older people and those with health concerns or disabilities.

Each session will include a guided meditation and relaxation to ensure participants leave feeling refreshed and rejuvenated.

WHAT DO WE NEED TO PRACTICE CHAIR YOGA?

We will be using the chairs at the village hall.

A blanket can act as extra padding as well as keeping you warm during relaxation.

A bottle of water can keep you nice and hydrated during practice.

PLEASE HELP TO KEEP YOUR VILLAGE HALL

Stamfordham Playing Field & Village Hall charity owns the Village Hall, Playing Field and Sports Pavilion and is run by a small committee of trustees who volunteer to give some of their spare time to do what is possible with limited resources and they are asking for your help.

A FEW THINGS YOU MAY NOT KNOW

- * The Village Hall is an old building costing, on average, £1,000 per month to run (electricity, insurance, oil, essential maintenance, minor repairs, cleaning etc). There are further costs associated with the Sports Pavilion and Playing Field too.
- * The Charity which is responsible for these Village Facilities only receives income from kind donations, fund raising activities, being hired for use by the local community and the generosity of trusts/ organisations to whom we can apply for grants.
- * Urgent and essential repairs continue to be needed at the Village Hall. We have achieved a great deal in the past few years but there is always more to do.
- * The new sports pavilion will not always be NEW and we have to put money aside for future maintenance work.
- * Some of the Village Hall facilities need bringing up to date (curtains/blinds, re-decoration, lighting repairs, carpets, kitchens updated, etc.)

By **donating** to Stamfordham Playing Fields & Village Hall (Charity No. 502613) through the **Covenant Scheme** you could help fund the essential works to the Village Hall and ensure it continues to be there **for your generation and the next**. If you haven't done so already, please consider signing up and, if you are a taxpayer, please complete a Gift Aid declaration. This allows the charity to reclaim 25% tax on your donation making every £10 you donate worth £12.50.

Once completed the **Standing Order form** should be emailed back to Sue or delivered to the Treasurer, Edward Trevelyan, at Low Cross House, 14 South Side.

The **Standing Order form** gives you details of the bank account for the Stamfordham Playing Fields & Village Hall charity so if you would prefer to set up your **Standing Order using Online Banking** please use your surname as a reference when completing with your bank online.

You should still **complete the form** and write 'Already Set Up Online' and deliver it to the Treasurer, Edward Trevelyan, at Low Cross House, 14 South Side (or, if returned to Sue via email, please mention 'Already Set Up Online' in the email it is attached to).

Equally, a **one-off donation** from time to time would be most welcome.

Stamfordham Playing Field & Village Hall is a charity and, if you are a taxpayer, everything you donate will be worth 25% more if you complete a **Gift Aid Declaration form**. This form should be returned to either Sue or Edward, as above, in order that it can be recorded and sent to HMRC.

Communities encouraged to mark Queen's Platinum Jubilee with special events

A Queen's Jubilee Events fund will be launched by Northumberland County Council to help communities celebrate the historic occasion during 2022.

The Queen will be the first British Monarch to celebrate a Platinum Jubilee, and to mark her achievement communities in Northumberland are being encouraged to host their own celebrations.

The national programme of celebrations will focus on the Jubilee weekend of June 2-5, which includes an additional bank holiday to mark the occasion. As part of the celebrations 1,500 Platinum Jubilee Beacons will be lit across the country and one in each capital of the Commonwealth. A number of iconic locations have been identified by the Palace however communities and organisations are also being encouraged to light their own beacon on June 2. A guide to taking part can be found at https://www.queensjubileebeacons.com/guide

A £70k small grant fund has been allocated by the council and communities will be able to apply for a grant to help with their local events. Grant criteria and details of the application process will be released shortly.

A temporary event co-ordinator role will also be supported by the council to work with communities to develop their events.

There will be a year-long programme of events taking place around the UK, the Commonwealth and around the World to celebrate the historic milestone. The Bank Holiday weekend will provide an opportunity for communities and people throughout the UK to come together to mark The Queen's 70-year reign. Across the four days the celebrations will include public events and community activities, as well as national moments of reflections on The Queen's 70 years of service.

Communities are encouraged to get involved in The Big Lunch event on the Sunday of the Bank Holiday weekend. Every year since the idea began in 2009 The Big Lunch has encouraged communities to celebrate their connections and get to know each other a little bit better, coming together in a spirit of fun and friendship. In 2022 The Big Lunch will bring the Jubilee celebrations into the heart of every community. People are invited to share friendship, food and fun with neighbours as part of the Platinum Jubilee celebrations. A Big Jubilee Lunch can be big or small-street party or picnic, tea and cake or a garden barbeque.

Cllr Glen Sanderson, Leader of Northumberland County Council said: "Her Majesty, The Queen is a true inspiration to us all. Her achievements and strength throughout her 70-year reign are something which we can all celebrate. At a time when things have been difficult for us all, I hope that The Queen's Jubilee will be an opportunity for communities to come together and mark this historic occasion."

Cabinet member for culture, Cllr Jeff Watson, said: "We want to bring back the spirit of The Queen's coronation when communities celebrated together with street parties and community events. We would encourage all our communities to start thinking about what type of events they could host so we can showcase Northumberland to the world."


