Northumberland County Council has set up a Review Group to examine its response and that of its partners to Storm Arwen. And talking of stamps, did you know that these 1st and 2nd class stamps are going to become unusable after 31st January 2023.





That's because Royal Mail is moving to a new system using barcodes. If you use the old stamps after 31st Jan 2023 they will not be valid and you will have to pay a surcharge.

The new stamps will look like this this \rightarrow



However if you have a stock of the old style stamps you can fill out a "Swap Out" form on Royal Mail's website from 31st March 2022, then post the stamps back and they will swap them.

Unfortunately you won't be able to do this at a Post Office.

So check all your drawers or make sure you use them by 31st January 2023.

Callers may say they are your bank, the police, HMRC, Microsoft etc. Banks will NEVER ...

- Ask for details like passwords, PINs or identify/respond codes
- Tell you to move money to another account
- Ask you to carry out a test transaction online

Even if the number looks like a genuine one, be alert and never give out your personal information to callers.






