The Widdrington Trust – part of village history and a force for good for 144 years

The Sir Thomas Widdrington Trust is a charity entirely run by a team of local volunteers from education and other walks of life, who give their time to carefully manage some village property for the benefit of local young people. The Trust has been in operation since 1878 and has seen many changes, developments and upheavals since that time, awarding many individual and school grants to further the education of local pupils.

The Trust exists to "Promote the education (including social & physical training) of anyone under 25 who lives (or have a parent who lives) in the Parishes of Stamfordham, Belsay, Capheaton and Matfen; or attended as a pupil at a school in Stamfordham or Belsay, who are in need of financial assistance".

The Trustees can award small grants for school, university or college education (including professional and technical); or financial assistance for example tools, instruments, books & travel; to assist in education (including music and arts) or to help prepare for entry into employment on leaving education.



The Trust can provide equipment and other items, services and facilities for any school situated in either of the parishes of Stamfordham and Belsay.



Stamfordham and Belsay Schools have used past funding for additional staff, trips and excursions, funding specific whole school projects, transport into areas which are a direct contrast to our rural environment, visiting artists, writers and cultural events; the trust has really broadened the experiences pupils have had access to. Individual grants have helped pupils with transport costs to further education, supporting degree level studies, additional training, research projects abroad and access to school visits. The Trust has also been able to contribute to community sports and play equipment schemes.

Most recently, the trust has been instrumental in helping individual families in Stamfordham and Belsay schools cope with the Covid-19 pandemic lockdowns; and the resulting reliance on technology, by providing devices on which to learn remotely, especially in households with multiple children.

The purchase of Chromebooks for schools has been subsidised by the trust; giving greater access to remote learning by a large number of pupils. This brings benefit to both current and future learning as key skills continue to be developed. The impact of these grants cannot be overstated and is a testament to the original purpose of the Widdrington Trust's Mission in an ever-changing world.

As one grateful Stamfordham parent put it:

"Honestly, having the loan of a school device made all the difference for him to be able to fully participate in homeschooling and now his level of engagement has really improved. He's taking much more ownership of his day, organising his workflow, exploring research tools and discovering how to set-up printing. Whoever knew a laptop could be so empowering?! This will give him such an advantage as he moves onto high school. Obviously we are enormously grateful to The Widdrington Trust for their generosity. Huge armfuls of appreciation for everything."

There will be <u>Lateral Flow Test kits</u> in the church, the pub and the hall, accessible on Thursdays during Post Office hours 11.00 - 1.00pm until we no longer have any delivered. See email below from County Hall

The Prime Minister recently announced that testing will be scaled back in line with the reduced risk from COVID-19. This means that free testing will end for most people from 1 April 2022, therefore Lateral Flow Devices (LFDs) will no longer be available for community distribution after that date.

From 1 April, there will be some limited ongoing free testing:

Limited symptomatic testing available for a small number of at-risk groups - the Government will set out further details on which groups will be eligible.

Free symptomatic testing will remain available to social care staff

<u>Please note</u> – Should you still have any stock of LFDs left after 1st April, these should be distributed to the community free of charge.

We would like to take this opportunity to thank you for participating in delivering lateral flow devices to the public. It has been a tremendous effort to ensure our local communities have had access to tests.

We will keep supplying test kits throughout March for you to distribute to your customers.

Again, many thanks for your cooperation in this task.

Feedback from the COMMUNITY BREAKFAST

It was great to see folk at the Community breakfast and beans and bacon sandwiches were much enjoyed while catching up with friends and discussing ways we could 'green Stamford-ham'. The following ideas were put forward:

Biodiversity promotion:

- Leave areas of unmown grass on the village green and verges. Various folk had seen this done in parks and on village greens where mowing around the edges main-tained the smart appearance of the area. It was noted that to promote a greater variety of species in subsequent years the patches would need mowing / strimming in the autumn and the grass raking off.
- Tree planting: verges leading into village, village green, and the possibility of school and other areas in the village subject to landowner / local authority permissions. The possibility of creating a community orchard and meeting area was also put forward.
- Help yourself raised beds planted with herbs and salads.
- Veg plant swap.
- The planting of bee friendly flowers and plants.

Carbon neutral target:

With current fuel price hikes carbon neutrality becomes a bedfellow of fuel poverty prevention prompting a lot of discussion. Ideas included:

- Finding a way of offering affordable, energy saving / insulation audits for households in village from trusted, independent operator.
- Public electric car charging point.
- Community car scheme.
- Drop off point for used domestic batteries.
- Solar panels on village hall.
- Dog poo digester to run a streetlight!
- Community energy generation.
- Looking for cheaper air source heat pumps / solar panels through promoting of available grants or through economies of scale.

And talking of stamps, did you know that these 1st and 2nd class stamps are going to become unusable after 31st January 2023.





That's because Royal Mail is moving to a new system using barcodes. If you use the old stamps after 31st Jan 2023 they will not be valid and you will have to pay a surcharge.

The new stamps will look like this this \rightarrow



However if you have a stock of the old style stamps you can fill out a "Swap Out" form on Royal Mail's website from 31st March 2022, then post the stamps back and they will swap them.

Unfortunately you won't be able to do this at a Post Office.

So check all your drawers or make sure you use them by 31st January 2023.

- Tell you to move money to another account
- Ask you to carry out a test transaction online
