Where does your veg come from? How has it been grown? What impact does food have on our environment? A few years ago now we asked ourselves these (and more) questions - seemed crazy to be surrounded by so many fields that were not feeding us (directly).



So we decided to become producers - and 11 years ago set up a cooperative with the intention of developing a community-owned farm.

It wasn't quite as easy as we thought - dreams never are! However we have achieved a great deal, growing seasonal vegetables - around 12 tonnes in 2021 (a bumper year) - sharing them with members from across the Tyne Valley and challenging ourselves to think more carefully about our environmental footprint by introducing a plastic free refill zone, offering organically produced foodstuffs, household goods and developing links with other local producers to bring members many tasty delights from Northumberland.

It wasn't quite as easy as we thought - dreams never are! However we have achieved a great deal, growing seasonal vegetables - around 12 tonnes in 2021 (a bumper year) - sharing them with members from across the Tyne Valley and challenging ourselves to think more carefully about our environmental footprint by introducing a plastic free refill zone, offering organically produced foodstuffs, household goods and developing links with other local producers to bring members many tasty delights from Northumberland.

GO local food now has @ 100 members and we are growing on 4.5 acres of land, using 5 poly tunnels in Ovington. Our newest field, which we are slowly learning how to use best, is down the road at Matfen. Members are very involved in running the coop and rely on 2 horticulturalists to lead the growing side.

Our expansion means we can supply more and so we are looking for more members to join us. And more ways to connect with local communities - particularly on this side of the A69! In addition to our collection point at Ovington we are exploring the possibility of establishing collection points – maybe Stamfordham could be one?

We'd love to tell you more and show you what we have achieved to date - **so here's your invitation to join us for a brew,** at the Ovington fields (we have a kettle and somewhere to sit there!) on :

DISRUPTION TO ELECTRICITY SUPPLIES
