GREEN STAMFORDHAM

In an attempt to do our bit for Climate Change the Parish Council has so far planted 20 free trees, from Northumberland County Council, at Bridge End. They are under the heading of "Natures Harvest" which consists of a mixture of Crab Apple, Hazel, Rowan and Elder. These are not large trees and are ideal for rewilding sites to give nature a helping hand as well as being good for our climate.

We have applied for another ten this autumn and would welcome suggestions of sites to plant them. This does not have to be all ten in one place, but thought must be given to sight lines for traffic and pedestrians alike.

A Flowering Cherry is also to be sourced to commemorate the Coronation of King Charles III and suggestions are also welcome for its positioning.

There are several mature trees in the village with none coming on behind. In the event of future storms, such as Storm Arwen, we could lose some of the older stock, we welcome contributions to plan the succession of the current mature trees in terms of species, location and number of trees that the village would plan to introduce on the green.

Stamfordham Bonfire & Fireworks

Saturday 4th of November was this year's bonfire and fireworks. It was another successful event with people enjoying it and leaving great comments on the Facebook page



We did the bonfire slightly different this year, we normally lift the turf then relay it. But with the ground being so wet we were going to struggle to lift it. We made the decision rather than not do the bonfire we built it straight onto the grass. We are buying turf to replace it.

The cost of the event is just over £3000, the major part of this is the fireworks coming in at £2600. Public liability insurance £250, first aid cover £200. We also buy the flashy glowing novelties to sell so we get that money back along with a little profit.

This year we raised just over £3200, the biggest part of that is the hog roast. The collecting buckets and the flashy things also make up a decent proportion. On top of that we get a fee from both the Ice cream van and the coffee van.

This year we have also done something we have not done before, that is make a charity donation. This is something we are looking at doing every year. This year we gave a £50 donation to the Teenage Cancer trust.

We have to say a massive thank you once again to Scott's Catering & hog roasts who give 100% of the profit from the hog roast. Collingwood marquees once again provided the tent for the first aid, this is free of charge. The Swinburne Arms run the weekly bonus ball draw and provide the location for the hog roast.

Without the continued support of these local family businesses the event simply would not happen. So please support them!

Have to say a big thank you to those that help on the day setting up and the day after clearing up. A special mention must go to Tom Henderson for his effort and help on the clean up it was really appreciated.

Thanks to Stamfordham first school for making the guy again this year.

On the night there are the bucket collectors who do an extremely important job, without them again we would struggle to keep the event going. Was good to have members of Stamfordham Young Farmers back helping with the buckets. I could try and name everyone, but I will probably miss someone.

This help is great and appreciated, but for future years we do need more. A few more bucket collectors, but also a handful of people to help with the tidying of the firework firing area. Its not the most glamourous of jobs but needs to be done.




