2024/17 Apologies for absence

There were no apologies for absence.

2024/18 To confirm the Minutes of the meeting of the Parish Council held on Thursday 16th May 2024

RESOLVED:

Members agreed the minutes of the previous meeting held on Thursday 16th May 2024 were a true record.

2024/19 Planning Matters

2024/19/01 Planning Applications received

- 24/01884/LBC: Heatherslaw Farm – Listed building consent for repairs to pigsty damaged due to strong winds using materials and techniques to return to former condition – no objections.
- 24/01953/FUL: Hawkwell Grange – First floor extension over existing single storey section – no objections.
- 24/02055/FUL: The Cottage, Dalton – Replacement 5 No existing windows with cill level lowered – no objections.
- 24/02184/FUL: 17 Grange Road – proposed first floor bedroom and ensuite with extended rear roof pitch, rear single storey extension to form a living, kitchen and dining area, double garage to north of plot – although not an objection, it was resolved to submit comment stating 1.Plans contained inadequate and conflicting information. 2. Solar panels could be located on both sides of the building.
- 24/02327/LBC Old Barclays Bank, 23 North Side – Listed Building Consent for internal alterations. At basement, remove concrete of plastic DPM and replace with stone flags bedded and pointed in lime mortar. At ground floor, open up area of wall between kitchen and hall. Close up South door to sitting room, remove 1974 lightweight projecting lobby on North side of sitting room. At first floor, replace existing modern dog-legged staircase and replace with half turn stair. At attic room, construct partition to create en-suite shower room – no objections.



Wonderful weather helped us enjoy fun activities inside and out as the children and young people heard stories from the Bible and considered their relevance to their own lives.

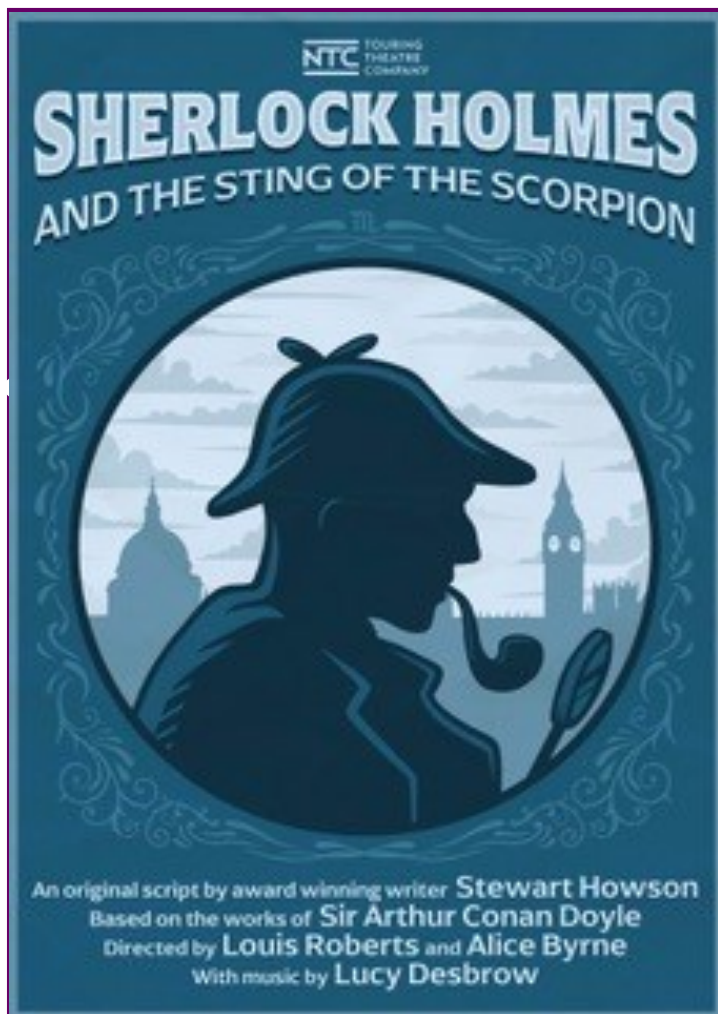
