

Further meeting held. Anything between 1 and 35 new dwellings could be built in the parish during the current Local Plan period, 2016 to 2036, however figures could be lowered due to greenbelt/open space reasons. Protected local space, green space differentiation, and a housing needs assessment were required, with funding available to carry out an assessment. Historical heritage register and community assets discussed. Pop up café to be held 12/10/24.

2024/35 Climate Change

2024/35/01 Bike track repair station. Members are asked to consider quotation(s) for possible bike repair station. Discussed above, Cllr Parker to forward costs to County Cllr. The intention would be to place the station outside of the village hall.

Chairman to follow up on possibility of EV charging point(s) in the parish.

Building continued to deteriorate, with Chimney stack considered dangerous. County Cllr had advised County Council the building is a health and safety risk, and would continue to lobby Enforcement to carry out a further site inspection.

Footpath between Dark Lane and church required cutting. Stile had been temporarily fixed, gate would be beneficial. Resident advised landowners would appreciate it if gates could be shut after use. Stile on footpath to Ouston required repair. Cllr Lloyd to contact Tim Fish of County Council.

Problem had been resolved, matter to be removed from agenda.

'Stamfordham Cricket Club – Season 2024 League Review'



The 2024 cricket season came to conclusion in late September, with Stamfordham Cricket Club (SCC) enjoying a fruitful but at times frustrating season. Having joined the Northumberland and Tyneside Cricket League over the past winter, SCC played a total of 23 league games in Division 5 South, winning 13 of them, and left them mid-table in the league standings. Several notable on-field performances were recorded. Alex Meadows (126), Alex Gray (115 not out) led the way with their batting contributions, Brahma Chowdray (6 wickets for 2 runs), Tarun Revathi (5 wickets for 24 runs) returned the top bowling performances and Andrew McGrath snaffled 14 wicket-keeping catches. On top of the league performance, during the early summer months, SCC had a fantastic midweek cup run, losing to eventual winners of the Dr Barlow Cup in the semi-final. An effort to be proud of given the challenging and competitive nature of the midweek tournament.

Having joined SCC from New Zealand for the summer, George Devine and Owen Rees, made a significant impact on our team's performance (and the Swinburne Arms takings). George especially stood out with his on-field performance as he finished as the top wicket-taker in the league, with 36 wickets, showcasing his flight, guile and skills to out-wit and think the batters. Not to be outdone, Owen finished third in the league batting statistics with 545 runs to his name. In addition to their onfield successes, George and Owen integrated well into the community having resided in the village for the past few months. They supported the junior coaching at the club on Friday nights and provided numerous sessions to the primary school children over the summer term. These endeavours were well-received by the children and parents of the Stamfordham community, and it is something SCC will be replicating next season.

The club had the honour of being invited to host four county representative matches this past summer. The recognition of the facilities and playing surface by Northumberland Cricket Board is a feather in our cap and something we are extremely proud of. In addition, SCC have hosted some fantastic social functions over the summer months, with the monthly quiz night, being held on the first Sunday of the month, becoming a regular fixture in the calendar. Our club dinner will be held on Friday 7th February, and we would like to invite members of the Stamfordham community to attend this evening to celebrate the successes of the club over the past year. Further details will be provided in the communicator in due course. Overall, SCC have had a successful season both on and off the field. 
