





How to use the Village Defibrillator

The Defibrillator is locked in a cabinet on the front wall of the Village Hall.

Here is a short guide on how to use it:

1) Ring the number in the front of the cabinet. They will then give you the code to open the cabinet and will also check that an ambulance has been arranged.

2) Press the code buttons and open the cabinet.

3) Take out the Defibrillator and take to the patient.

4) Open the casing and lift the Defibrillator lid to open.

5) Follow the voice prompts. You will be instructed to attach one sticky pad to the patient's upper right chest and also one near the side of their ribs under the left arm.

6) If the chest is hairy it is important to shave a small area with the enclosed razor, so the sticky pad will stay in place.

7)When the pads are applied, the Defibrillator will analyse the heart activity and will give voice instructions from here.

8)It is vital that somebody is giving CPR to the patient whilst you are collecting and applying the Defibrillator pads. The CPR must continue until the Defibrillator instructs you "do not touch the patient".
