Minutes of an ordinary meeting of the Parish Council held on Thursday 20th July 2023 commencing at 730pm in Stamfordham Village Hall

1. Apologies for absence

To confirm the Minutes of the meeting of the Parish Council held on Thursday 18th May 2023
 It was resolved that the minutes of the previous meeting held on Thursday 18th May 2023 be accepted as a true record.

3. Meeting with County Council to consider a Neighbourhood Plan for the parish

Mark Harrison and Sarah Brannigan present from County Council Neighbourhood Planning team. The law requires that planning decisions are made in line with the County Council development plan. Twenty plans had been adopted in the county and currently being used to determine planning applications in their areas. The benefits set out requirements in advance for new development in an area, inform and guide decisions on planning applications and ensure that the multitude of individual decisions add up to something coherent for the area as a whole. A MP can cover new housing, conversions, design, local green space, heritage assets, settlement boundaries, landscape, community facilities and village centre. The process is as follows: County Council designate the neighbourhood plan area, engagement with community, identifying issues, developing vision and objectives, building evidence, drafting policies, screening for environmental impacts and carrying out environmental impact assessments if required, consultation on draft plan/re-draft plan before submitting to the County Council, publicising of draft plan and inviting comments, independent examination of plan, local referendum, and making the plan. County Council provide a dedicated Link Officer, attendance at relevant meetings and events, support with creation of consultation material and key supporting documents, advice, guidance and assistance on creating a useable and legal Neighbourhood Plan. A National design code can make a development more local or site specific, such as density, roof lines, to take into account conservation areas. Local green space would give the same level of protection as green belt. The Parish Council could link up with a neighbouring parish to produce a joint plan. The levelling up Act is currently at the last stage, going through the house of lords which is to include legislation and secondary regulations, including the role of Neighbourhood Plans and contributing to an adaptation to climate change. The bill also states all Local authorities have to produce their own design guides. Funding for Neighbourhood Plans is through government via locality, with grants of up to £10K available, which is usually used to engage the services of a planning consultant. The plan has to be assessed for environmental impacts. Further technical support available. Stamfordham isn't allocated any housing specifically, the delivery numbers in the Northumberland Plan have in some cases already been met. The M.P. should be made aware of a Neighbourhood Plan via the County Council.

- 23/02390/FUL: Well House, Hawkwell Extension to existing double garage to provide study/recreational room as well as additional storage to rear and outdoor terraced space it was resolved to object to the proposals, although it is a minor application, it is adjacent to a river or stream which will clearly be affected by the application.

• 23/01514/FUL: South Barn, Harlow Hill - proposed oak framed porch to south (front) elevation.
