Winter 2014

Now that our beautiful summer and our even more beautiful autumn are a fast fading memory, I realise that it is time to update you all on Parish Council news.

We are now very engaged in preparing a **Neighbourhood Plan** for Barnwell Parish. Although we have a full complement on the Working Party, we would always welcome volunteers to help us. If you are interested in helping please contact me on 270311. We are hoping to hold an Open Day in the village hall in the spring, which we have applied for a grant to fund. At this event we hope to get everyone's ideas and advice so that we can move the plan forward. Please look out early next year for flyers and posters with further details.

I am sure that you will have noticed that the **village notice board** is in need of a little TLC. We are planning to have it stripped down and oiled, and to have two doors put on the back which will not be locked so that anyone can place a notice there without it getting wet! We are also planning to move the board across to the village green, and site it next to the phone box away from the outfall of the lime trees, which is presently damaging the wood.

We have now been advised by the Environment Agency that they have established that there is a colony of **water voles** living in the area around the ford. As water voles are a rare and protected species, we have decided to erect an **information board** at the ford detailing relevant facts about water voles which we hope everyone will find interesting. It is hoped that this project will be funded from County Councillor Wendy Brackenbury's Empowerment Fund, and we are very grateful to her for her kind support. We have also been offered possible funding by a couple of Wildlife Trusts if we need extra finance, which is greatly appreciated.

At the end of September the village gathered at the Village Hall to thank **Ron and Pat Rutterford** for their many years of service to Barnwell in running the Post Office and Village Shop, and to wish them a long and happy retirement. We all enjoyed the wonderful tea party and many thanks to be everyone who helped to organise it. We are pleased to welcome Jay, Vicky and Judy who have taken over from Pat and Ron, and we hope that they will enjoy many happy years living here in Barnwell. This village is very privileged to have both a shop, a Post Office and a pub and they all contribute so much to making Barnwell a very special place. (They even enhance our house prices!). We must remember that if we don't use them we will lose them.

Here is a message from Jay:

A message from Jay, Vicky and little Judy. We have now been in the beautiful village of Barnwell for over two months and are enjoying life here.

We would like to thank everyone for their support and warm welcome over the last months. We hope to improve both the Post Office and shop to give the local community better facilities for the future. Thank you again for your continued support.

Footpaths & Cycleways - the Parish Council is again pursuing the idea of clearing and re-instating the **footpath to Armston Road**. We have heard from Sarah Barnwell, the Community Liaison Officer, who is going to have the footpath inspected and then do a site visit with County Councillor Wendy Brackenbury and local representatives to assess what needs to be done and how much it will cost. It is unlikely that anything will be achieved in the current financial year, as budgets have already been allocated, but, in principal, Sarah will consider doing the work next year depending on available finance.

In the meantime Sandra Cartledge has agreed to co-ordinate a letter writing campaign in support of the project. On behalf of the Parish Council, I would urge you to give this your backing.

On the subject of the creation of a **cycleway towards Oundle**, we have received some encouraging news from Neil Holland, Access Development Officer (Walking & Cycling) for Northamptonshire Highways. He advises that his colleagues in the design team are currently putting together a detailed design for the shared-use path along the one-way section of the old road to Oundle and also on the Barnwell side of the A605.

It looks as if they may have sufficient funding left in this financial year to construct the path, although this is subject to the final target cost of the scheme, which will be calculated as part of the design work. Any Section 106 funding they subsequently obtain from the Marina development can then potentially be passed over to their budget to offset their outlay and help facilitate cycle/foot way improvements elsewhere in the area.

Neil Holland will liaise with Councillor Nick Bould, who has been monitoring this project on our behalf, and let us know if they get the go-ahead and when construction is likely to take place.

We are still looking to recruit a **Flood Warden** for Barnwell following the retirement of Gerry Allen after many years of valuable service, thank you Gerry. Please contact our Clerk, Lorna Lovell on 733689 if you are interested in taking up this post.

As you are all no doubt aware, next year is an **election year** so if anyone is interested in standing for election to the Parish Council please contact our Clerk, Lorna Lovell, to obtain the relevant forms. The election will be held in May 2015.

It is perhaps a little early, but, nonetheless, I would like to wish you all a very Happy Christmas and great 2015.

On behalf of the Trustees, I would like to thank all our helpers who so generously gave their time to make this event such a happy occasion. A magnificent sum of £1,076.00 was raised, thank you to everyone.

Our Trustee, Phil Cook, has retired after an amazing 43 years in office. A valued and committed Trustee, Phil has been instrumental in the modernisation of the cottages. Now, with the double-glazed windows, storage heaters and walk-in showers, our Grade II listed buildings are well-maintained and have lovely gardens. Our best wishes go to Phil and his family and thank him for his long years of service.
