It is really important that we retain these amenities in the village, so if you know of anyone who might be interested please let them know of this opportunity. There will be an Extraordinary Open Meeting of Barnwell Parish Council on Tuesday 01 May at 7.30pm in the Village Hall to discuss the situation with the shop and everyone is welcome to attend.

We are making good progress with the project to provide a new children's playground in the garden of the Montagu Arms. We have acquired the funds needed and are now waiting for building permission which, unfortunately, can take up to 8 weeks to be processed. Hopefully, barring any last minute hitches, we should have the equipment installed in time for the summer holidays. The playground project is one of the three beneficiaries of the Waitrose Green Token Scheme this month so please get those tokens dropping!

I would like to take the opportunity to remind everyone that we discourage parking on the village green. We are reluctant to put up " no parking " signs everywhere and, although we understand that parking around the Church Hill are can be frustrating, we would ask that you do not park on the green.

The police have informed us that theft from vehicles is on the rise and they advise that belongings should not be left visible in cars, especially

overnight, and vehicles should always be locked when parked, even on your property. In addition there are gangs around who may come to your house purporting to sell you things or offering to do jobs for you. They are bogus and you are strongly advised not to engage with them.

### **BARNWELL ENTERTAINERS**

Barnwell village is again gearing up for a huge community effort. This time it's the entertainers preparing for their next production in the Village Hall. The group have been producing full length plays and shows for over 30 years. The village has only 150 households so over the years a good percentage of the population have been involved. Not quite Oberammergau but if you visit the village in the next few weeks you may well see the nuns, the Archbishop, the jilted lover, the pushy reporter or the gardener wandering the streets.

The play, Drinking Habits, written by award-winning playwright Tom Smith is frequently performed in America but very rarely in this country so the chances are you won't have seen it. It is a play about the threat of a small convent closing its doors and two nuns who desperately try to keep it open by secretly making and selling wine. Accusations and mistaken identities run rampant in this belly-laughing farce as two reporters go undercover, producing paranoia throughout the convent that spies have been sent from Rome to shut them down. Wine and secrets are spilled as everyone tries to preserve the convent and reconnect with lost loves.

The story takes place at the convent of the Sisters of Perpetual Sewing. The wine part will come naturally to the cast but probably not the sewing which may be a challenge for some of our actors. Most of our set construction crew are fresh from creating Barnwell Bonfire and again our

better informed about crime and police activity in their local area, and help us to keep their communities safe? The messaging service, (formerly known as Community Connect), enables frontline police officers and PCSOs to send alert messages direct from their mobile devices to thousands of local people. They can do this in real-time while they are out and about policing the county.

The alert service is free and simple to activate by registering at <a href="https://www.northamptonshireneighbourhoodalert.co.uk">www.northamptonshireneighbourhoodalert.co.uk</a> and is available to anyone living or working in Northamptonshire.

After signing up to the messaging system, you will receive regular alerts from Northamptonshire Police, Neighbourhood Watch and other partner organisations, keeping you up to date and informed about crime and issues relevant to you and the area where you live or work.

Alerts are received either by email, text message or voice message – whichever suits. You will also be given the option of what you want to receive alerts about, and how often – you will only receive messages about topics that you have selected.

Our communities play a crucial part in helping us prevent and detect crime and anti-social behaviour. Police officers and PCSOs will be regularly sending out message alerts via Northamptonshire Neighbourhood Alert, appealing for help, highlighting suspicious activity, offering crime prevention advice, and keeping people up to date about general police work and safety events.

This community messaging system allows information to be shared really quickly and much more directly with the public about crime and activity in their specific locality, helping us to involve and protect the community much more. If for example, there has been a spate of distraction burglaries in a particular district or an increase in vehicle crime, we can tell people immediately via the alert system. So they can better protect themselves and be more aware of any potential threats and risks. We can also very quickly share descriptions of suspects or appeal for witnesses – giving us a

#### VILLAGE STREET LIGHTING

The street lighting in the village is becoming old, extinct and expensive. EU legislation has banned the manufacture of some of the lanterns that we use and so replacements are becoming scarce.

Consequently the Parish Council are proposing to replace the street lighting and we are considering quotes at the moment.

The replacement lights will be white LED lanterns (similar to those that already exist at the newer part of Castle View) and we anticipate the level of illumination will be as current levels. The capital cost of the replacement will be spread over a number of years and that annual cost should be covered by the savings we make on the cost of electricity.
