There are a number of projects that you will see being completed in the next few months:

- the defibrillator should be installed in the village during the summer further details on when this has been activated and training courses will follow.
- the St. Andrew's Church clock is about to be renovated and the repair work will be carried out in early summer.
- the chancel roof of St. Andrew's has been in need of repair for many years. Thanks to donations, events and grants the work is planned to start in May and will take place over the summer. The project will cost in excess of £75,000 and will enable the church building to continue to remain open and active for baptisms, weddings and funerals as well as regular services in the future. Keeping our Church active also includes many activities outside the church itself Rev Cathy Brazier works throughout the week in our benefice community at Polebrook School and Barnwell Little Ducklings Pre-School, taking services at the Polebrook nursing home, meeting the housebound and helping those going through personal difficulties.

The works to both the clock and the roof require scaffolding to be erected, and we would ask anyone walking through St Andrew's Churchyward to be aware that work may be taking place and to take note of any signs or barriers. Please also be extra vigilant if you see any unusual activity taking place out of normal working hours, as there have been a number of lead roof thefts recently in the neighbourhood. We will be patrolling regularly and taking extra precautions during this time.

The annual Pudding Club took place in the Spring and by the time you read this you may have also enjoyed the Food Festival on 7th May in the village hall. There certainly seems to be a foodie theme to our events this year!
