Cheque Out And Over!

A TEAM of fundraisers have given a North Wales charity, set up to provide expert medical help to paramedics, a major cash boost in memory of a village teenager.

Jacqueline Jepson, of Cadole, lost her 16-year-old daughter, Sarah, after she suffered head and chest injuries in a car crash on November 1, 2013 on the A5104 at Penymynydd. Sarah, a Coleg Cambria A-level student, was a passenger in a Peugeot 206 when it crashed into a cattle wagon.

Since Sarah's tragic death, her mum has led a fundraising campaign to raise funds for, and awareness of, the North Wales Emergency Doctor Service (NWEDS), after a doctor from the charity tried desperately to save her daughter's life.

In May, Jacquie, helped by family and some of Sarah's wide circle of friends, organised an auction of promises event which was held at the Village Centre.

And on Wednesday, May 24, on what would have been Sarah's 17th birthday, Jacquie joined around 60 teenagers, many of Sarah's Mold Alun High School friends, for a sponsored fancy dress walk up Moel Famau. The fancy dress walk saw Buzz Light Year, Super Mario and a host of other wacky characters trek to the summit in an event organised by Enya Maguire, of the village, and Nadia Lahraoui, both then 16, two of Sarah's closest friends.

Those events, coupled with other donations raised more than £7,500 for NWEDS and Jacquie, her neighbour and close friend Ceri Morris, 31, who was also Sarah's godmother, Enya Maguire and Nadia Lahraoui met up with NWEDS volunteer doctor, Mike Bloom, an Anglesey GP to present their monster cheque.

Jacquie said: "I'm so grateful to everyone who supported the fundraising events we have organised on behalf of NWEDS. To raise as much as we have is incredible. And Enya and Nadia have worked so hard and deserve huge credit for what they have achieved.

"I really want to raise the charity's profile in any way I can. It really is a wonderful charity that can make a massive difference and potentially save a great many lives.

"My aim is to see every volunteer NWEDS doctor supplied with an emergency bag containing all the equipment they need. And I want to see Sarah's name on each bag too."

She added: "I chose to present the cheque to Dr Bloom at the Dyfnog Stud, Llanrhaeadr, Denbigh where my horse, Puddle Jumper, is stabled.

"I'm looking for a company to sponsor Puddle Jumper horse blanket so we can have the NWEDS logo embroidered onto it so when he competes at show jumping or point to point events we can further promote the charity."

Launched in July 2010 with four volunteer doctors NWEDS began working in conjunction with the Welsh Ambulance Service with doctors alerted to major incidents, such as road crashes or mountain falls, when they occurred. The number of doctors now signed up to the scheme is nine covering the whole North Wales region and as NWEDS doctors are volunteers, they receive no pay or allowances when they attend incidents.

NWEDS doctors, Aruni Sen and Mike Bloom, who launched the charity in 2010, attended the auction of promises event to explain what they do and how the charity works.

And at the Dyfnog Stud where he accepted the cheque on behalf of the charity Doctor Bloom said: "Jacquie's continued support is going to make a huge difference going forward and I know they are planning lots of other fundraising events in the future, including a sponsored parachute jump."

Rudolph Back In The Village


SANTA'S reindeer will once again be visiting Gwernymynydd having promised to drop in on the village school for the Christmas Fayre.



IT'S been a long time since I wrote about waste and re-cycling and as one or two people have asked me lately where all the rubbish goes I thought I'd explain.

There are articles in the Press from time to time suggesting that just about all our waste ends up in landfill but I am glad to say our waste and recycling in Flintshire has very definite destinations where it is sorted and recycled and here are some of them:

Non-recyclable waste (black bin) goes to Cory Environmental landfill.

- Asbestos to Runcorn
- Batteries/washing machines etc go to the West Midlands
- Cans to Warrington for aluminium, others to Sandycroft
- Glass, cathode ray tubes, tvs to Ellesmere Port
- Fire extinguishers to Preston
- Fluorescent tubes to Trafford Park
- Food waste to St Asaph
- Hazardous waste to Saltney
- Paper to Shotton
- Plastic to both Runcorn and Saltney
- Mattresses to Denbigh
- Oil to Liverpool
- Furniture to Flint

Destinations can change from time to time and some goods have to go to special places to be dismantled. And some items are only collected at Household Recycling Centres but not at the kerbside.

The main message is, that if we are to meet our recycling targets and increase the percentage of waste that is recycled, then we must all keep sorting.

Meningitis support

Next month I hope to attend a meeting in the Commons to discuss Meningitis. It's quite simply a terrible disease that can cause misery and tragedy for many, and the effects of it have already unfortunately been felt in Gwernymynydd and across Flintshire.

Meningitis can be divided into two main types; viral and bacterial meningitis. Viral meningitis is reasonably common, but rarely fatal. It presents like flu and cannot be treated with antibiotics. Bacterial forms are comparatively rare, but extremely dangerous and can be fatal. It can, and does, strike indiscriminately and there is much more work to be done to end its dreadful legacy.

So I want to help to raise awareness and ensure charities and researchers fighting this disease get the support they need to tackle and end this disease.

Autumn Statement

The Government's Autumn Statement is coming up on December 3 which will lay out their economic plans and priorities ahead of the main budget next March. I believe Gwernymynydd can thrive with the right policies and the right support thanks to the hard work of businesses and employees across Flintshire.


