Cedwyn's Gift to Cottage Nursing Home

A POPULAR village man who died following a 14-month battle with motor neurone disease has paid tribute to those who cared for him from beyond the grave.

Cedwyn Smallwood passed away on October 17 aged just 65. His uplifting funeral was attended by more than 300 people who raised £1,500 for Mold's Cottage Nursing Home where the dad-of-three lived prior to his death.

Cedwyn's wife, Lorraine, said her husband had asked that donations made at his funeral go to the home as a 'thank you' for all they had done for him.

Lorraine said: "He had everything planned to a 'T'. The amount of money donated at the funeral was amazing but since then many other friends and neighbours have made further donations and the amount raised is now in excess of £2,000. I'm so grateful and cannot thank everyone for the love and support shown to Cedwyn and our family over the last few years.

"I know the Chronicle carried a report on the donation made in Cedwyn's memory to the Cottage Hospital but not everyone will have seen that. I wanted to let all our wonderful friends in the village know, through the newsletter, how grateful we are."

The Cottage Nursing Home's training manager Cath Peach accepted the cheque from Lorraine and said the cash will be used to help fund new equipment.

Cath Peach added: "Cedwyn was such a lovely man who will be missed a great deal. He taught us a lot about a disease we knew little about and really opened our eyes."

PUPILS swapped pens for garden spades as they joined volunteers in planting more than 400 trees and shrubs in the grounds of the village school.

The saplings were supplied by the Woodland Trust Wales after the school applied for a free tree pack from the charity under a scheme which aims to see thousands of trees planted and new woodland created in the coming years.

Headteacher Louise Williams says the idea is to make the school grounds both a haven for wildlife and a more pleasant area for children to play. She said: "We wanted to put in some low hedging that would make the fencing around part of the school grounds look more appealing while also creating an area within the grounds that birds and other wildlife can use and children will find more appealing. It's going to take a few years for the trees, hedges and shrubs to become established but we think it is going to look fantastic and will really complement our new pathway."

She added: "And of course we also used the planting session as a nature lesson so children were learning as they helped plant the trees and shrubs."

Volunteer Gill Dobson, of Pantymwyn, a former Community Forest Officer with the Woodland Trust, says the new trees will help the school grounds become a really good wildlife area. She said: "It's

wonderful. We have planted oak, hazel, birch, rowan and hawthorn so rather than just be a wide area of grass, once the trees become established, there is going to be a really wonderful area that will also be a fantastic teaching resource."

VOLUNTEER doctors from the North Wales Emergency Doctors Service (NWEDS) now have new rucksacks crammed full of vital medical equipment thanks to the money raised by friends of family of Sarah Jepson.

Sarah, 16, of Cadole died following a car crash in November 2013 despite the best efforts of paramedics and a NWEDS doctor who attended the scene of the crash.

Since Sarah's tragic death her mum, Jacquie, her family and Sarah's friends have been fundraising to fund the purchase of the new rucksacks and to kit them out with all the equipment the doctors need.

Now the NWEDS doctors have been supplied with their new rucksacks with each one bearing Sarah's name and a dedication to her memory.
