

We are pleased to open our second newsletter knowing that we have attracted the attention of the Chester Chronicle and the Advertiser. The Advertiser, of the 24th. OCT., published two articles relating to the Village, one about the Newsletter itself and the other one about the Film Show and talk given by Assistant Divisional Fire Officer Mr. N.L. Neale. This Talk was very well attended and it is hoped that the future talks and/or filmshows will be equally well attended. The next Talk will be given by Police Constable John Evans of Prestatyn. He will be talking about his work and answering questions. It will take place on Wednesday 27th. November at 7.30 pm at the Junior School.

TELEPHONE BOX. The Mold Rural Community Council have objected to the telephone box being moved. For reasons previously given, the committee feel that this move would be a good one, we still do. On the same bit of ground the Council did a grand job of clearing up and landscaping. But what about those two half erected seats! Could it be that someone disapproves of these seats. Mr. Hughes, Community Councillor, would like to know peoples opinions on this, whether to keep the seats where they are, to move them to the top of Blaenwern or to put them on the Play Area. The Committees view is that the seats should be finished off where they are and additional seats provided on the Play Area.

POLLUTION. The positive identification of Dutch Elm disease has moved Clwyd Council to carry out tree preservation work whenever they are notified in time. If you have a tree that you suspect is a little 'off colour', an early warning might save it.

It is also disturbing to hear that the dumping of Carbon Waste is to resumed again in the vicinity. This was stopped by the old Flintshire County Council, but we understand that the Secretary of State for Wales has recently accepted a recommendation that it may be resumed. Does anyone have strong feelings on this subject?

TREES, SHRUBS and DAFFODIL BULBS. The Community Council are currently surveying this area with a view to having trees and shrubs planted in selected local areas. The Junior School are involved in similar work at Loggerheads under an All Wales Environmental Improvement Scheme launched by the Prince of Wales Committee. The Youth Club have already planted a mass of daffodil bulbs at Loggerheads.

BUS STOP. Some time ago the Committee suggested to the Community Councillors that the piece of waste ground adjoining the Police House should be purchased and used to provide a pull-in and shelter for the bus stop. Mr. Hughes has reported that there is shortly to be a site meeting with local Councillors and the County Surveyor.

HOW. The Gwernymynydd Horse Show and Gymkhana was a success and the Show Committee were pleased to announce an overall bank balance of £248-34. Of this £25 has been given to the O.A.P.s Committee with the hope that it will be used to provide entertainment at the party that is to given early next year. £23-34 is to be used to provide a goal post and name board for the Village Field. Of the remaining £200, half is to be kept for next years Show and the remainder will be the subject at another meeting.

PANTOMIME. The pantomime, CINDERELLA, with Freddy Garrity, Ayashea, Frank Carson and The Foremost is at Liverpool Empire. If sufficient people are interested in going to see this in mid-January the cost will be Approxiamately £1-50 for Adults and £1-25 for Children, for seats in the middle stalls. This includes the coach fare each way and entry into the theatre. To enable us to organise this we must know who would like to go, before the 20th. NOVEMBER.
