Village Centre.

It was nice to hear that a donation of £150 from the Mold Carnival Fund presented to the Youth Club for the village has been passed on to the building fund bringing the total to over £700. The estimates for further work to be done, however, come to approx. £4000. This includes the provision of car-parking facilities, pathways, furnishings and equipment, finishing the electrical and plumbing work, paint, floor sealer, hire of sander, etc., etc. Mr. G. Roberts, our Delyn Councillor, has agreed to support or approach to Delyn Borough Council for some financial aid. It was agreed at the last meeting of the committee to press forward in an attempt to get the essential work done in the hope of an Easter Opening.

We will need a wagon load of sand and gravel for the paths and we are going to need HELP to barrow it from the road to the building. Anyone with a barrow and spade and an hour or two to spare please come along to do this when we settle a date for delivery.
