PLAY AREA ON TROS-Y-WERN ESTATE - RESIDENTS REQUEST RESTRICTIONS AT COUNCILLOR'S SURGERY. The only 'queries, worries and complaints' received at the Councillor's Surgery held on 24th May at 7.00 p.m. came from residents surrounding the play area on the Tros-y-Wern estate. Complaints included INJURIES to a 2 year old and 7 year old from bicycles; INJURIES to small children from footballs; BREAKAGE of greenhouse glass by footballs; DISTURBANCE of gardens by retrievers of footballs; ABUSE of the equipment by teenagers; FOUL LANGUAGE from the same teenagers; NOISE until after 10.00 p.m. It was agreed to have a sign erected by Delyn restricting the use of the area to children UNDER THE AGE OF 11 YEARS, i.e. those attending Junior Schools, Infant Schools and Pre-School children and for the area to be CLEARED BY 7 P.M. NO BICYCLES AND NO BALLS. Meanwhile we appeal to all parents to help in the matter by ensuring that their teenage children do not use this area. There are alternative facilities for teenagers in the village.
