A number of us feel strongly enough about this to consider it worthwhile to employ the services of a solicitor to represent our case. We have made enquiries of a lawyer experienced in this type of work and he is prepared to represent us for the day at a cost not expected to exceed £200. We already have 22 firm pledges of contribution so no-one will be called upon to contribute a large amount. The possible infringement of the green belt affects the whole village so please come and give your support by attending a meeting to discuss the above at the village hall on Thursday, September 28th at 7.30 p.m.
