The Welsh Imperial Singers. The singers were a professional chorus of the war years. They were drawn from every part of Wales and each member was a well known soloist noted for their virile and disciplined singing. They made highly succesful tours of Britain and North America. They made records, sang on radio, appeared before royalty and were acclaimed everywhere. On stage they were strikingly dressed in bright red swallow tailed coats. A book about them Cofio Cantorion : by Alun Trevor (Gwasg Carreg Gwalch; £3 from bookshops) was recently published and proceeds from sales will support the National Eisteddfod. The author is the son of one of the singers the tenor Jabez Trevor. The singers first came to sing in Mold in November 1926's Their two concerts were so popular that they came again the following month. In the 1930's their concerts were held in the Assembly Hall and Savoy Cinema.
