COMMUNITY COUNCIL Members heard with deep regret of the death of former councillor Tim Devine on Friday May 19th. Tim was elected to Gwernymynydd Community Council on its formation in 1985. He served as a councillor for ten years, being joined at a later date by his wife Gwerfyl. Both were former Chairmen, and both retired from the council prior to the recent May election.

A letter of condolence has been sent to Gwerfyl and their daughters on behalf of the members and the local residents.

This is due to her promotion to the Police Crime Desk and a letter of congratulation and thanks has been sent to Sue, whose work in this and surrounding villages has been much appreciated.

PUBLIC FOOTPATHS Graham Humphreys, who retired from the Community Council prior to the elections has been highly praised for his work on the preservation of our public footpaths. His councillor colleagues, and also members of the Community Association and the Rainbow Ramblers agree that his continued efforts during the past ten years have been the forefront of the drive to have footpaths restored and reinstated. Only one footpath remains unopened and efforts to have it re-opened are in hand. Thank you Graham for your hard work and determination.
