September 2010

Community Council

On June 30th a very busy meeting of the Development Plan steering group was held.

The Framework document which precedes the final Development Plan document was reviewed. The Editorial group led by John Seddon and Elwyn Owens were thanked by Chairman Chris Bradshaw for the hard work they had done in preparing and circulating the document before the meeting. Due to its comprehensive size, the focus was directed on the four Plan Policies – with the other contents to be reviewed at a future date. A detailed review of each Policy statement was made with extensive discussion, and agreement was reached over important issues. Jane and Paul Roberts proposed that each policy should be summarised with a chart to simplify the issues, and this was agreed. The Editorial group was due to report back to the Steering group at a meeting on Wednesday July 21st - later changed to Tuesday 27th.

On July 9th a meeting at the Cadole /Loggerheads Boundary Stone on the busy A494 trunk road successfully concluded a series of discussions between local residents and the North Wales Trunk Road Agency, Aimed at improving the safety of the road through Gwernymynydd, Cadole and on to Loggerheads, the discussions depended on Community and County councils from both sides of the border reaching agreement with the Trunk Road Agency. Improvements have been agreed regarding the hazardous car parking issue on the side of the road between Cadole and Loggerheads. Double yellow lines are to be added to the road together with signs prohibiting parking on the grass verge. Within Gwernymynydd, changes will be made to the road markings, with additional traffic islands positioned at appropriate places.

Chairman of Gwernymynydd Community Council Cllr. Chris Bradshaw said, "Many people were involved in several meetings with the Agency and it was appropriate that the final one was at the Boundary Stone between Denbighshire and Flintshire. These issues have required involvement from both Llanferres and Gwernymynydd Community Councils- and it's hoped that the improvements will be introduced later this year and during 2011".

At the July meeting of the full Community Council, news of the resignation of popular member Rachel Morrell due to pressure of work was received with regret by Chairman Chris Bradshaw and fellow members .who sent their best wishes. PC Gary Aldous being on leave, PCSO Andrea Ellis who was off duty, said in a letter she was pleased to tell members no crime in the village had been reported during the past month. Cllr. Elwyn Owens reported on the Steering group meeting held earlier in the week on the 27th The chairman said the consultation with residents made it clear they were keen to expand the village social and environmental issues and praised their involvement

The chairman also said the Pantomime proposed for February 2011- the idea of which was born as a result of the Development Plan, was progressing well. More performers and backstage workers were very welcome, and a Director was urgently needed. Anyone interested in joining at any time should ring Sharon Godwin on 01352 759209 (See Page 3). In reports from organisations, Village Centre chairman Keith Taylor said that thanks to help from County Cllr. Nancy Matthews, the gates to the Village Field adjacent to the Centre had been repaired and hopefully a ramp for prams would be introduced. Chairman Cllr. Bradshaw thanked Cllr. Matthews for her constant help. He and Cllr Elwyn Owens reported on a recent meeting which he and other group members had held with the Welsh Assembly's Chief Planner to discuss clarification on the status of Community Plans and local planning arrangements. He said the Welsh Assembly had no great appetite to formally acknowledge the role of Community Development Plans other than they can help in the evidence base for local development plans. Cllr. Owens said the framework document presently being developed by the editorial group would have to be modified to reflect the current views of the Assembly regarding planning issues. A new completion date for the Gwernymynydd Development Plan was agreed as May 2011.

The next meeting of the Community Council is Thursday September 30th at the Village Centre 7.15pm. The public is always welcome to attend.

Also present is County Cllr. Nancy Matthews should anyone need her help or advice.
