

## **Community Council Rejects Plans For New Homes**

COMMUNITY councillors have given the thumbs down to a planning application for 18 new homes in the village.

Wainhomes submitted the application which would see the new dwellings built on land adjacent to Siglen Ucha (pictured above). However, following a public meeting held in the village centre and attended by more than 30 residents, councillors felt they had no option but to object to the proposals.




Vice chair of the council, Liz Parry, said: "Councillors felt the application, which would involve the construction of a large retaining wall which will tower over the road, would be totally out of character with the rest of the village.

"There are also serious concerns with regard to sewerage and potential problems from surface water. Further, a new access point from and to the site will potentially exacerbate traffic problems on the already busy A494."



### A Million Reasons To Celebrate

A CANCER survivor has set herself an incredible challenge - to row a million metres on a static indoor rowing machine before her 30th birthday.

Bethan Jones, 29, was diagnosed with Hodgkin's Lymphoma in September, 1999 when she was aged just 17.

Due to her job Bethan now lives in Chesterfield but still gets home to the village to visit mum, Lynn, and dad, Colin Jones, at least one weekend a month. She said: "I had a large lump on the right side of my neck which for a number of months doctors put down to a throat infection. I was eventually sent to an ENT specialist in Wrexham. He took one look and arranged a scan.

"I was admitted for a biopsy and had a small piece of tissue removed for tests. This left me with a large scar and seven stitches. Less than a week later I was diagnosed with Hodgkin's disease. I must admit it was a shock, after all cancer only happens to other people and you never imagine it will be you, but I was also relieved in a way."

She added: "I started chemotherapy three days after my diagnosis and had five weeks of treatment. I had weekly chemo injections and consider myself lucky, I lost my hair but didn't really suffer too many side effects! I spent six weeks at The Christie Hospital in Manchester, where I underwent radiotherapy treatment. I stayed as an in-patient only coming home to Gwernymynydd at weekends."

Now fully recovered Bethan says she wanted to do something a bit different to raise funds to support cancer charities as a thank you for the help and treatment she received.

She said: "I enjoy going to the gym and particularly like the rowing machine. I came across the Million Meter Club and decided to tackle a million metres myself before my 30th birthday.

"I hit 30 on New Year's Eve. I just thought it would be a great way to raise funds to help in the fight against cancer. It's proving tough and I have the blisters to prove it! I'm over halfway now and would really appreciate any help from anyone who would like to sponsor me."
