Margaret and Peter Fraser, and their team of helpers, did a marvellous job organising the afternoon and I am sure everyone thoroughly enjoyed it.

The amount of cash raised on the day was boosted by the donation of £105 from Dennis Hughes of Hafod Park, Mold in memory of his wife, Rosemarie Hughes, who passed away, aged 71, on August 31st.





COUNTY councillor Nancy Mathews is warning residents to remain vigilant following a dwelling house burglary in the village.

She said: "I understand that cold callers had been active around the village the day before this burglary took place. Gwernymyndd and Cadole are particularly safe places in which to to live and we should not become too alarmed by what is likely to be an isolated incident.

"However, can I ask that everyone keeps an eye out, not only on their own property but for those of their neighbours too. And take down registration numbers of any suspicious vehicles in the area and don't hesitate to call the police if in doubt. It's always better to be safe than sorry."

The subsequent discussion focussed on the strategic agenda in the Village Development Plan, and ways in which the Village Centre may be developed.


Paul Roberts, who chairs the Village Centre Management Committee, said: "We really appreciated Colin Everett meeting us and the discussion was constructive and helpful.
