

THE VILLAGE Centre is going to look terrific for the Christmas Fair and the Carol Concert.


At our last Centre Management Committee we discussed how we could offer experience to residents who may have paper qualifications but need to prove to future employers they perform well in the real world.

#### February Quiz Night



A SERVICE of Remembrance at the Village Memorial was attended by more than 30 villagers.

Conducted by the Rev Mary Brotherston the moving service included the laying of a wreath of poppies at the base of the cenotaph.



The Stephenson family, who live in the old school house rang the old bell to start the 11am minutes silence.

And the football match between Swan Gwernymynydd and the Hare and Hounds, Connah's Quay, due to kick-off at 10.30am, was delayed until 11.10am with the players also showing their respects.

Community Council chair, Marjorie Thompson, said the service was as poignant as ever.

She said: "We were delighted so many people turned out for the service and it was nice to see so many young people in attendance too.



"It is important we remember those that made the ultimate sacrifice in fighting for our freedom in conflicts around the world.

"And of course there are young men from our village who are doing their duty in dangerous places such as Afghanistan today."

#### **Public Meeting Hears Building Development Plans**

A HASTILY called public meeting in the Village Centre was held on November 25th following Wainhomes Ltd's submission of an amended planning application to build 18 houses at Siglen Uchaf, off Ruthin Road.

The meeting, attended by more than 30 villagers, heard that the application varies only slightly from a previously submitted application. In fact the new plans have changed just one type of proposed house and made alterations to the internal roads of the development to protect trees already present at the site.

Those that attended the meeting remain bitterly opposed to the development due to what is perceived will be a dangerous access and egress from the site, potential flooding and sewage problems. It would also significantly damage the landscape and involve a massive retaining wall which would be visible to most of the village. (See the pictures opposite.)

Marjorie Thompson, Chair of Gwernymynydd Community Council, explained that the council would be making it's objections known to the Head of Planning at Flintshire County Council before the closing date for letters on November 29th. The application is now on the agenda for the Planning and Development Control Committee meeting on 12th December at the Council Chamber in County Hall. #### **Disgusting Habit Is Spoiling Village**

THE problem of dog fouling has once again been highlighted by a Uwch Y Dre resident.

Using the feedback form available on the village website the angry resident, who does not wish to be identified, said: "In the last 10 days we have an incident of dog fouling on the walk way between Uwch Y Dre that crosses over Godre'r Mynydd and into Heol Y Wern.

"There is an area of grass which a dog owner has taken to using and not picking up! My husband and myself are dog owners and on our daily walks we are picking up after this other dog owner.

"We are unsure as to whether they are new to the village, or new dog owners. I have contacted Flintshire County Council to report this and to request brochures and resident leaflets.

"We want to keep our village clean and safe. Any assistance would be greatly appreciated."

Community councillor Carl Jackson said: "I totally agree with this resident. Rest assured anyone who lets their pets foul footpaths or green spaces within the village will be reported should they be identified.

"It's disgusting and potentially very dangerous. Lets keep our village clean and a place we can all be proud of."





#### GET COOKING WITH CAFFI FLORENCE CHEFS



#### **Homemade Mincemeat**

Homemade mince pies beat those bought in the shops hands down every time and are even better again if you make your own mincemeat. It is incredibly easy and early December is not too late. It is worth making in a 2kg quantity as in this recipe as it makes a wonderful filling for baked apples that can be enjoyed long after Christmas.

To make about 2kg (4 large jam jars)

1 large cooking apple - peeled and grated 600g dried fruit: currents, raisins and sultanas 300g vegetable suet 250g dark brown sugar (muscovado) 100g chopped peel zest and juice of 1 lemon & 1 orange 50g chopped almonds 1 tsp mixed spice 1/4 grated nutmeg 1/2 tsp cinnamon 100ml brandy

Soak dried fruit in orange and lemon juice for a minimum of 1 hour. Add all other ingredients, except the brandy and stir well. Place in a very low oven 120C gas  $\frac{1}{4}$  for 2 – 3 hours in a bowl, dish or pan covered with a lid or foil. Remove from the oven and allow the mixture to cool before adding the brandy and stirring well before jarring.

Jars should be prepared as for jam making ie cleaned and sterilised in the oven: 120C, gas  $\frac{1}{2}$  or through the hottest cycle in a dishwasher. However the jars should be cooled before filling or else the suet will melt and separate.

#### **Our Man in Westminster Reports**

I am aware of a planning application for Siglen Ucha, to build new houses and a retaining wall at the southern end of the proposed development.

I know many people have some strong views on the proposals and I hope residents were able to engage with the application process before the submission deadline at the end of November



People in Gwernymynydd will know that the consultation over the proposed closure of Mold Hospital Minor Injuries Unit has now closed. I hope many of you took the time to make your feelings known on the issue.

I have been told by the Health Board that a decision over the future of the Unit will be made after Christmas in January.

I opposed the closure because more than 5,000 people a year use the services currently provided in Mold. It is also especially important for people living in villages such as Gwernymynydd and Cadole as transport is a factor. The alternatives are Deeside and Wrexham, neither of which have particularly good transport links.

Local GPs have also expressed their concern and I now hope the Health Board takes our legitimate concerns into consideration when making its decision.

Finally, I want to wish everyone in Gwernymynydd and Cadole a peaceful and enjoyable Christmas break. I hope you are able to spend time with family and friends at this special time.

#### **Hare And Hounds Sent Packing**

SWAN Gwernymynydd coasted into the second round of the Deeside Sunday League Division 1 Cup after thrashing Connah's Quay's Hare and Hounds.

Terry Pughe smashed in four to add to single strikes from Ant Williams and Steve Messam-Jones as Swan saw off the hapless Hare and Hounds 6-2 in a one-sided affair.

Swan manager, Glyn Jelley, was delighted with the win which means the Swan's are still on target with their aim of reaching a Cup Final this year.

Glyn said: "Having been promoted last season we wanted to consolidate this year which I think we are doing. We also set a target of reaching at least one cup final and we are still on track to do so which is pleasing.

"The kick-off was delayed by 35 minutes for the game against the Hare and Hounds out of a mark of respect for the Remembrance Day service being held at the village war memorial in front of the Community Centre.

"The players also observed a minute's silence at 11am, just before the game kicked-off."

Glyn added: "The appalling weather we have suffered means we have had a number of games postponed but we hope for a strong league run after Christmas which we hope will give us a respectable league position come the end of the season."
