"Dam" Housing Proposal Refused Planning Permission



FLINTSHIRE County Council's Planning Committee has rejected an application by Wain Homes to build new dwellings on land adjacent to Siglen Ucha.

The Committee met on Wednesday, February 20th and refused the application - despite planning officers recommending the plans be approved.

County Councillor Nancy Matthews addressed the Committee voicing her concerns that the housing scheme was inappropriate and not a fitting development within an Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty.

A number of village residents also attended the hearing and listened carefully to the proceedings.

However, disappointingly, due to the fact the hearing was arranged with just five days notice, no community councillors were available to speak at the hearing.

Cllr Nancy Matthews said: "The application was refused mainly on the effect the development would have on what is an Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty.

"Members of the Planning Committee attended a site visit and that gave them the opportunity to see the scale of the proposed retention wall which they referred to as a 'dam'."

She added: "Personally, I am not against development on that site so long as its sits within the shape and contours of the land and sadly, what was proposed certainly didn't do that.

"Wain Homes can appeal to the Welsh Assembly Government Inspectorate. Whether they do so is a decision for them, however, I am satisfied that the Planning Committee has listened carefully to what we have said and have come to the right conclusion."



THE perennial issue of dog fouling is back in the spotlight after several complaints to both the Community Council and County Councillor Nancy Matthews.

And there are now calls for a Dog Watch scheme to be set up in the village.

Cllr Nancy Matthews says dog fouling is a problem that affects everyone at one time or another. She said: "There is nothing worse than finding you have stepped in something unpleasant when you get home from a walk! The fixed penalty for allowing your dog to foul the pavement is £75. And if you do not pay this you are likely to be prosecuted which could result in a fine up to £1,000. Responsible dog owners clean up after their pets but it is those that don't that we want to catch.

GET COOKING WITH CAFFI FLORENCE CHEFS

Roasted vegetable risotto with wild garlic



The wild garlic that grows prolifically around here is just emerging and the young leaves are ready to pick. It is claimed to have great health benefits and tastes amazing.

You only need a small handful - it is very powerful. Please don't pick anything in the countryside if there is only a few sprigs or take the bulbs. Also, take care to pick well away from footpaths and potential dog weeing areas!!!!

200g risotto rice
1 large red onion
2 courgettes
2 peppers – red &/or yellow
1 small aubergine

3tbsp olive oil 10 leave of wild garlic 50g butter 1 litre vegetable stock Parmesan cheese

- Place baking dish in oven with olive oil & heat at 180°C for 10 minutes until oil is hot.
- Add vegetables chopped into bite size pieces into baking dish & cook for 45 minutes.

Meanwhile prepare risotto:

- Heat stock until almost boiling. Melt 25g butter in large saucepan and sweat finely chopped onion until soft but not brown. Add rice and mix well until rice is coated with butter.
- Add 1/3 stock and bring to gentle simmer and cook until stock has been absorbed.
 Add a further ladle of stock and cook until absorbed.
- Continue this process of adding stock until rice is cooked. Add the final 25g butter, roasted vegetables, torn garlic leaves and season to taste.
- Top with grated or shaved parmesan.






Eric, who runs his own company, Eurojargon Enterprises, says he has been putting in some serious training miles in preparation for the gruelling race.

Manager Glyn Jelley - who has rubbished reports he missed the game due to being away on a stag weekend, insisting he was on a scouting mission as he looks to bolster his defence - says his side were left bitterly disappointed.

He said: "Wes Brereton scored to put us 1-0 up against Flint RBL. But we then had what appeared to be a perfectly good goal disallowed for offside and then the referee turned down a blatant penalty appeal.

"We then got hit by two late long balls and they snatched the win 1-2. But their keeper was outstanding by all accounts and was named man-of-the-match by a mile."

He added: "The week before we beat top-of-the-table Mechanics 3-0 in what was an excellent league game. Terry Pughe, Dafydd Griffiths and Liam Hett all scoring. That result came on the back of another cup-semi final defeat, 0-1 to Flexys in the NE Wales Challenge Cup.
