Village entrepreneur helps tiny babies



Gwernymynydd mum Chloe Jones is using her greeting cards business to raise funds for premature babies.

Chloe lives with her husband James and their little boy Jude. Some may know James Jones as a former Wrexham AFC player, but the family's biggest journey together wasn't on the pitch, it was in the neonatal intensive care unit (NICU) at Wrexham Maelor.

Their son Jude was born very early, at just 25 weeks, and spent 122 days in the NICU.

Both Chloe and Jude fought for their

lives in intensive care. Those months were the most challenging the couple have ever faced, and along the way Chloe discovered how much a thoughtful word or kind gesture can mean to a family living in the NICU world.

Inspired by her experience, Chloe created Warmth in Every Print, a small greeting card business with a big heart. Her range includes cards designed especially for NICU families and baby loss support, as well as a full collection of everyday cards for birthdays, thank-yous and all of life's moments.

A key part of her mission is giving back, so 10% of profits from the NICU card range go to neonatal charities. Thanks to incredible support, including from Wrexham AFC owners Rob McElhenney and Ryan Reynolds who generously donated £10,000 to their fundraiser, Chloe has already helped raise over £20,000 for NICU causes.

MOUNTAIN HARMONY CHORUS

You may not have heard of Mountain Harmony but we are no strangers to Gwernymynydd, having had weekly rehearsals in the Village Centre for the past twenty five years. Founded in 1989, we are a ladies singing group who enjoy the pleasure, friendship and health benefits of singing together regularly. But we are a group with a difference in that we believe we are the only ladies barbershop group in Wales.



Barbershop singing originated in the southern U.S.A. after the abolition of slavery when male harmony singing became popular in barbershops which were the local social centres of the time. It needs no musical accompaniment and is made up of four parts, one melody line and three harmony parts which are sung only slightly higher or lower than the melody line.

There are many types of music which can be arranged for barbershop singers. Although we sing some traditional barbershop classics, we also have modern chart toppers and songs from film and musical theatre in our repertoire.

Unsurprisingly we have yet to find an arrangement of any Welsh language song but there may be one out there somewhere!

We sing regularly at local events and for charity and have competed both at Llangollen and at music festivals, particularly Chester Music Festival, where we have been cup winners on a number of occasions. We love what we do and if anyone is interested in joining our happy band of singers please come along on any Monday evening at 7..30 pm. We would be delighted to see you and you can be sure of a warm and friendly Mountain Harmony welcome.


IMPROVED PUMP TRACK
