

# **Kirkwhelpington Memorial Hall**

## **Annual Report to Kirkwhelpington Parish Council May 2024**

The Memorial Hall, together with St Bartholomew's Church provides a focus for the life of the community in Kirkwhelpington. A considerable number of groups meet regularly – the Bowls Club, the Music Group, the Youth Club, the Art Club, the Wannie Ladies, Yoga and Pilates, occasional ballroom dancing and there is a monthly coffee morning. The furniture and equipment for the Annual Village Show is stored in the hall, which also provides a venue for the catering on Show Day. There is usually a production by a visiting drama group in the Autumn. There are meetings of local statutory and non-statutory bodies like the Parish Council, the Forestry Commission, Northern Power Grid, B4N, the Ray Wind Farm, the National Trust and others. The Hall is a venue for private parties, fund-raising activities for local bodies and for gatherings following weddings, baptisms and funerals at St Bartholomew's Church. Growing co-operation between the Hall and the Parish Council has led to the installation of a generator to provide a "warm hub" for the community during power cuts.

Since a major Millennium development in 2000 the management committee have continued to invest in the hall with a high level of maintenance and re-furbishment and in 2003 it was agreed to accommodate the village post-office. The "supper-room" was re-organised for this purpose. The sub post-office run by Mrs Eileen Rogerson, who is also the Hall caretaker, has become an essential feature of the local and wider community with the closure of many post-office and bank/building society branches. The committee is in the process of planning further developments to improve the accommodation for the post-office, to rationalise storage facilities and create a more pleasant outdoor patio/garden and Summer social gathering area. The Memorial Hall has been in existence since 1924 and in November 2024 the committee is planning to celebrate the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Hall's foundation.
