5. Covid 19 - Brolly Group Update

Admin gave brief update - no further activity but meeting scheduled for Wednesday 28th

6. Micro Grant Applications

Green team – £500 towards cost of Willow Weaving course. This will be available for up to 40 local residents at a cost of £37.50 which is 50% of the full costs of the course. This grant is in addition to the £1k approved by SFCT and has been required due to high demand for the course. Approved by email now ratified. Admin to send cheque.

Spin & Chatter Group - £119.90 to cover the cost of a Zoom membership to allow the group to meet for longer periods of time. All agreed but decided to ask SFCT first to see if the group could use their account.

Fire Report

- All quiet with call outs, only 1 minor incident
- Home fire safety visits are still ongoing albeit remotely
- The new Fire regs on Smoke detectors in domestic properties which was due to come in in February has been postponed until Feb 2022 due to Covid
- Recruitment is ongoing with a few interested locals, medicals are an issue at the moment, some folk having to travel to Glasgow for medicals as most GP surgeries are carrying out Winter Flu vaccinations
- Regular checks will be carried out in the area leading up to Bonfire night and any illegal bonfires will be dismantled and advice given

Boleskine Community Care

Hub updates

- Hub walk was very successful on 15th Sept. Unfortunately, due to further government guidance we have decided not to continue with them until the next Gov. update
- Movin Aboot has also been cancelled until lock down changes are made
- The MacMillan coffee morning events did not take place but will be re-planned. No date yet.
- Christmas Fayre is cancelled. Will possibly take place early Spring
- Community Market in partnership with Green Team will take place 31st October. Fancy Dress and pumpkin carving competition. Another Christmas Market set for November. This is also dependent on Gov. update due on 26th October
- One of our Trustees will be retiring in November. Janet Hobson has supported the community and BCC for many years and will be missed

• Footcare continues within our RA and Gov guidelines. This is a very popular service.

Brolly Group

• The last food boxes for the first tranche of funding were delivered 28th September. BCC was pleased to be a part of that, and we look forward to being able to support any further aid for the community.

Care at Home

• Through the commitment and dedication of the staff team, this continues to be provided to a good standard and is much appreciated by the community. 19/05090/FUL | Construction of 5 affordable houses. Formation of access to public road | Land 140M NW Of 1 Hillhead Inverfarigaig – *qoing to planning committee in December*

20/02318/FUL | Erection of house and micro distillery with storage shed | Land 330M NE Of Purple Lodge Gorthleck – *going to planning committee in the new Year*

20/02471/FUL | Reinstatement and alterations to fire damaged house; siting of 10 No holiday twin-units, reception, store, car parking; installation of sewage treatment plant | Baile Os-Ceann Foyers Inverness IV2 6XT - going to planning committee in December

Discussion had about 20/03521/FUL | Erection of house, formation of access & temporary siting of static lodge | Land 165M SW of Dunelm Gorthleck Inverness — it has come to the attention of the CC that although the planning application has not been approved, the temporary static lodge is in place already. Admin to contact planning

11. Roads

PP & PH attended a ward Zoom meeting that covered roads as a topic. Jet patching is ongoing until next year as larger teams are unable to work at the moment due to Covid restrictions. MD told the Council that due to an increase in Council Tax, there will be extra money available next year for roads. New passing places signs are coming soon to replace missing and defaced ones. New Grit bins discussed – colour options available. SH concerned that a green bin might attract rubbish. Decision required on whether new bins have a latch or purchase hasp & staple for them which the fire brigade have offered to fit. Suggestions for locations for new bins – hill just before Errogie (on the Gorthleck side), 2 at Newlands hill & 2 on the Dalcrag road

12. Correspondence

- Euroforest Timber Harvesting Along the B852. Road closure of Dalcrag and Loch Bran road will be required for up to 5 days but it will be either one or the other road, not both at the same time. No dates arranged yet but will be publicised as soon as decided
- Glenda Bailey had raised a query with the vice-chair re community business development. Enquiry to be sent to MD

13. AOCB

- The ward meeting that PP & PH attended discussed how different areas coped in lockdown & how communities can become more resilient. Peer support from other CC's was advised
- PP raised potential joint meetings with SFCT. This had been suggested during the Foyers public toilet sub group meetings. All agreed these could be very useful
- PP suggested that the CC ask SFCT if the Covid grant for groups could be opened up again.
 Admin to write to SFCT
- The Green Team had asked PP if the CC would do an application with them to the Community Climate Asset Fund. On looking at the application it would appear that the Green team could apply in their own name. Admin to contact to discuss the application
- PH discussed what NatureScot has been doing since April through the Scottish Outdoor Access campaign to try and promote good behaviour amongst visitors. PH to share the document with the Councillors
