## Rules of the Show

1. Entry fees are 20p per entry or children 5p per entry.
2. All articles presented for competition in Section 1 (vegetables) and 2 (flowers) must be grown by the exhibitor whose garden will be liable to inspection by members of the committee.
3. Pot plants entered should be in the ownership of the exhibitors for at least 2 months.
4. Exhibitors may not re-enter any items in Sections 4, 5, 6 or 7.
5. The committee reserves the right to reject any entry and their decision is final.
6. Exhibitors may not enter more than two entries in any one class.
7. The judge's decision in all cases shall be final and only they shall have power to award prizes according to merit.
8. Exhibitors must return their completed entry forms to 3 Grimscott Estate Launcells not later than Wednesday 14h August.
9. Exhibitors are requested to put official cards, which will be supplied on the morning of the show, face downwards under each exhibit. Exhibitors without official cards will be disqualified.
10. Doors open at 7.30am. All exhibits to be staged by 9.45 **am** on the day of the show and must not be removed before 3.45pm. If not removed by 4pm exhibits will be sold for Show funds.
11. Please will exhibitors collect their prize money by 3.30pm
12. The committee will take care of exhibits but will not be responsible for any loss or damage which may occur
13. No unauthorized exhibitor will be allowed in the hall while the judges are awarding the prizes.
14. These rules will be strictly enforced.
