Welcome to the new and improved update for those who live in the Market Bosworth policing area.

As ever – we've had a busy month with a variety of challenges. From the resource intensive house explosions in both Ratby and Peckleton, to dealing with anti-social behaviour at Gopsall Wharf and Groby Pool.

Cross Border

Officers have done some cross border engagement with local farmers from this area, and farmers from NWLDC area.

The Chief Constable and the Police and Crime Commissioner

attended a farm in Appleby
Magna to discuss crime trends,
what matters to rural people
and gave updates and
information about crime
prevention. BBC News, ITV
News and Radio Leicester were
interested to hear – especially
in the wake of 3 males being
charged with ATM thefts locally.

Consultation with the community has identified the following priorities that we will be concentrating on over the coming months:

In the Spring/Summer 2017 there were a number of

complaints received from local residents across the beat area about excessive traffic congestion as a result of local tourist attractions. A number of local residents have expressed their concerns to us that they are going to experience similar issues this year. This month officers will be taking a proactive approach around this visiting such attractions and discussing what provisions they have made to address the problems experienced last year.

Update from PCSO Rich Heath

Whilst attending Market Bosworth Water Park and I have been proactive in ensuring that the traffic and congestion on busy summer days does not get out of control as it has in previous years. This has become a real issue in the area, especially as Bosworth Water Park is becoming more and more popular as the years go on. Among the number of ideas I have put in place I have arranged for active police patrol signs to be put up along the Wellsborough Road with regular patrols by special constables. Tickets will be issued to vehicles parked illegally and announcements will be made on a megaphone detailing the fact that tickets will be issued if vehicles are not moved.
