This month we as a beat team and a community have said a sad farewell to the much loved PC 537 Phil Hale as he embarks on a new life of retirement. Phil served as a Leicestershire police officer for 30+ years across response and neighbourhoods ending his years in the Market Bosworth station. However as one leaves us, another one appears. The team have welcomed PC 658 Allan Charles back to the team on a 3 month attachment. Many of you may already know Allan from his time as a PCSO on the beat and will know his enthusiasm and work ethic will be sure to stand out around the villages.

This month has seen 250 incidents called in across the NH29 beat. 20 of which were anti-social behaviour related, 10 involved our local parks and 15 involved young people. 25 were rural crime related and 38 were of a serious emergency nature.



Proactive work from the team #Yousaidwedid:

YOU SAID: Anti-social Behaviour:

WE DID: Across the beat we have seen a spike in the amount of Antisocial behaviour related incidents that have been called in over the summer holidays. Whether that be issues with youths on the parks or the never ending use of cannabis. Desford has become one of the main hotspots on the beat for continuous ASB; use of e-scooters, cannabis, playing loud music, littering etc. The team are very aware that the issues are beginning to show a community impact so wherever possible Hi-VIS patrols are being carried out day and night. PCSO 6598 and PCSO 6073 have also carried out a patch walk at Kirkby Road Park with parish councillors and HBBC to target the ASB.

YOU SAID: Road Safety Issues:

WE DID: Traffic specialised mobiles from Force Headquarters have been out in the area of Sutton Cheney as a result of the residents' concerns regarding speeding. The local beat team have also been in the area of Sheepy Magna as a result of the same concerns.

YOU SAID: Hare Coursing

WE DID: Hare coursing is a crime not highly recognised by many and in fact seems to be one that is most common on our rural beat. Hare coursing is the act of trespassing on someone's land with the intent to let dogs loose to catch wildlife and drive disrespectfully over someone's crop/field. Officers have attended reports of live hare coursing and spoken with those involved and given strong words of advice in relation to their actions.

We urge farmers to ensure the necessary precautions are put in place.


