YOU SAID: Anti-social Behaviour:

WE DID: We are pleased to say that there has been a reduction in some of our previously persistent ASB areas. We will continue the patrols in the day and the evening that we have been doing, and hope that this continues. Please let us know if there are any ASB issues locally to you, as if it is not reported to us, we cannot take action.

YOU SAID: Road Safety

WE DID: This is a continued priority for our beat, with lots of rural country roads, we find road safety and specifically speeding, is a huge concern. We are carrying out speeding operations throughout the month, in collaboration with our road policing team.

YOU SAID: Rural crime

WE DID: We have still been working with our local land owners and encouraging people to recognise the signs. If something doesn't look right, it probably isn't, so please get in touch and let us know. We also now have a monthly meeting with our dedicated Rural Crime Team to share information. Joint working with other teams and police forces has helped to recover a stolen trailer this month.
