Hello and welcome to your March 2022 news letter for the NH29 beat!

Spring is starting to feel like it's arrived, we hope that you are enjoying the better weather we have been having. We have had a great month so far and have been busy all over the beat.

We have attended parish council meetings, a rural conference at Twycross Zoo, National Careers Week at a school in Stoke Golding and a Cubs meeting in Market Bosworth as well as our usual speed checks and traffic enforcement across the entirety of the beat!

The team have been to a training day with BASC central this month, learning some hands on training with shotgun safety, poaching shooting and trapping. The fantastic training given will prove invaluable when out and about across our beat, and will help our team to be able to deal with incidents more efficiently and effectively.

There has been an increase in catalytic converter thefts in our neighbouring North West Leicestershire area, as well as our own. Hybrid vehicles are the most targeted by thieves. Try to park your car in a garage overnight if possible, or if not, park in a well lit area covered by CCTV or that is highly visible to neighbours.

### Work from the team #Yousaidwedid

YOU SAID: Anti-social Behaviour:

WE DID: With the nights getting lighter and warmer, we've had an increase in calls relating to youths acting in an anti social manner. This has been especially prominent in Newbold Verdon and Desford with "knock door run" and damage to fences and communal property. This behaviour won't be tolerated by the beat team and investigations are underway to identify those responsible.

YOU SAID: Road Safety

WE DID: We are continuing to hold traffic enforcement operations on the beat, ranging from speed checks and weight restriction checks through to joint operations with VOSA and DVSA to take illegal and dangerous vehicles off the road.

YOU SAID: Rural crime

WE DID: We have seen a large increase in the amount of fly tips that have been dumped on our rural roads, sometimes in the middle of the highway making it completely impassable! Please, if you are paying for someone to take your rubbish/green waste away, do some research and use a reputable company. Ultimately, if we find anything whilst investigating the tipping that leads back to your address, we'll be knocking on your door!
